God Demonstrates His Glory

There are primarily 2 ways in which God is viewed in the world.

From the Secular perspective

Or the Biblical perspective.

And as we shall see this morning, the majority of the world and even the majority of the Christian church views God from a secular perspective.

What do I mean by secular

Secular comes from Anglo-French *seculer* and Late Latin *saecularis*, meaning "worldly" or "pagan."

1: an ecclesiastic (as a diocesan priest) not bound by monastic vows or rules: a member of the secular clergy 2: layman

R.C. Sproul said one occasion, it meant "outside the temple"

A Secular mindset has man at its center.

God is subservient to the needs and rights of man.

Man is the center of his universe.

God exist for Man

To see this fleshed out in a more practical way in our Christian world or more specifically our theological, diadactic and doctrinal beliefs

would mean.

A secular mind would view God as

- 1. Reactionary rather than Determinative
- 2. Servant rather than King
- 3. Dependent rather than Sufficient
- 4. Observational rather than Predictable
- 5. Love rather than Judge
- 6. Frustrated rather than Fulfilled
- Lonely rather than Trinitarian
- 8. Forgiving rather than Judgmental
- Man has a right to the gospel
- 10. God has done man wrong if he doesn't get a chance to believe
- 11. Man has a right to live
- 12. God has do wrong to allow evil
- 13. God owes all men forgiveness
- 14. God is so loving he will forgive all men.

I Fully expect to find this kind of thinking in the world. After all the Bible says clearly

2 Co 4:4

the god of this world has blinded the minds of the unbelievers, to keep them from seeing the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God.

Jn 12:40

40 "He has blinded their eyes and hardened their heart, lest they see with their eyes, and understand with their heart, and turn, Jn 3:19-20

loved the darkness rather than the light because their works were evil. ²⁰ For everyone who does wicked things hates the light and does not come to the light,

But what is sad and should not be the case is that you should find a secular mind in the Church.

We have the truth. We have Self Revelation of God in the Word of God.

Our minds and hearts should be permeated and saturation with His Word so that every root and every rotten fruit of a secular view of God is removed.

We should be thoroughly Biblical

When This Biblical mindset is compromised, and or set aside for a more secular view God becomes minimal and man becomes Major.

Ro 1:21-23

²¹ For although they knew God, they did not honor him as God or give thanks to him, but they became futile in their thinking, and their foolish hearts were darkened. ²² Claiming to be wise, they became fools, ²³ and exchanged the glory of the immortal God for images resembling mortal man

This is why the majority of the church today has a theology that is man centered and not God centered.

This why you can have a theology like:

1. Openness of God - denies that God knows the future

2. Arminianism-

- 1. Denies the Sovereignty of God in Salvation
- 2. Makes God a reactor to mans self originated faith rather than a God who gives Faith.
- 3. Makes God a victim of ruthless men as he watches helplessly an men kill His Son
- 4. Makes God a helpless bystander in the call of men to Christ.
- 5. Makes God the victim of sin, that has the power to undo the Salvation that he paid for completely
- 6. Makes the future turn on the will of man rather than the will of God.

3. To have a book and then a movie to be produced called the Shack that is a Blasphemy

The Shack is not exception. The movie version of the book *The Shack* will be in theaters starting this Friday. Anyone who has a minuscule modicum of discernment knows that this movie is full of heresies, the primary one being a blasphemous illustration of the Trinity.

In *The Shack* we see all three members of the Godhead taking on form—God the Father as Papa, God the Son as Jesus, and God the Holy Spirit as Sarayu. In the film, all three roles are depicted by human actors. In this way, Young gives form to God the Son who actually took form, but also to the

immaterial Father and Holy Spirit who did not and will not take form. Giving form to the immaterial is the very transgression forbidden in the second commandment.

.....encounters manifestations of the three persons of the Trinity. God the Father takes the form of an African American woman who calls herself Elousia and Papa; Jesus Christ is a Middle-Eastern carpenter; and the Holy Spirit physically manifests as an Asian woman named Sarayu.

4 Michael Gungor is a musician in the Contemporary Christian Music (CCM) band, Gungor. He has been noted for denying the Genesis account (Source) and working with Rob Bell (Source). Recently, he has made statements on his Twitter attacking Penal Substitutionary Atonement, the belief that Jesus died on the cross in our place. he started out by rebuking musicians who sing about this doctrine (Which is essentially the Gospel), referring to it as, "a Father murdering his son."

He continued to assault the Gospel, calling Substitutionary Atonement "horrific" and stating "It's the most evil view of God that it is possible to have."

Thru this secular mindset in the church. The Glory of God is systematically being dismantled.... Brick by brick the temple that contains the Glory of God is removed.

When they are finished, we will have No God, but simply a figment of the secular mind.

What I want you to understand is The Supreme, Ultimate and eternal purpose of all that is is for the Glory of God.

God does not exist for you, You exist for God's Glory You are alive because God gets glory from your life Your Salvation is not for you, but for God's Glory If you never hear a presentation of the gospel, it will ultimately be for His Glory. If you die in unbelief and spend eternity in Hell, it will be for His Glory

From the past eternal decrees of God in predestination to the future eternal enjoyment of our inheritance in the age to come, God's goal and purpose has been that his glory be praised, especially the glory of his grace.

Most secular critics of the faith see the living of the faith as a hardship that stifles humanity and lead to unhappy and unfulfilled lives. They see us shackled by dogmas that limit us and confine our search for truth and greater self actualization and development.

Phonetic Spelling: (fan-er-o'-o)

protithémi: to set before, i.e. propose

Original Word: προτίθεμαι **Transliteration: protithémi**

Phonetic Spelling: (prot-ith'-em-ahee)

Definition: I purpose, design beforehand, determine.

Cognate: 4388 *protithemai* (from **4253** /*pró*, "towards" and **5087** /*tithēmi*, "to place, set") – properly, to place before, setting forth in advance to achieve a particular *purpose*. [**4388** /*protithemai* ("to purpose") is the root of **4286** /*próthesis* ("God's *providence*, eternal *purpose*), see *NAS dictionary* and *Zodhiates Dictionary*.]

endeixis: a pointing out or indication, a proof

Original Word: ἔνδειξις, εως, ἡ

Transliteration: endeixis

Phonetic Spelling: (en'-dike-sis)

Definition: a showing, proof, demonstration, sign, token.

Cognate: 1732 *éndeiksis* (a feminine noun) – (a brand of) *display*, emphasizing the *character* of the demonstration which is made *obvious*

(undeniable, conspicuous). See 1731 (endeiknymi).

sunistémi and sunistanó: to commend, establish, stand near, consist

Original Word: συνίστημι, συνιστάνω

Part of Speech: Verb

Transliteration: sunistémi and sunistanó

Phonetic Spelling: (soon-is-tah'-o)

Definition: I place together, commend, prove, exhibit;

instrans: I stand with; I am composed of, cohere.

4921 *synistáō* (from 4862 /*sýn*, "union, together *with*" and 2476 /*hístēmi*, "to stand") – properly, "stand together," referring to facts "lining up" with each other to *support* (*commend*) something.

- **2.** to set one with another i. e. by way of presenting or introducing him, i. e. **to commend**
- **3.** to put together by way of composition or combination, to teach by combining and comparing, hence, **to show, prove, establish, exhibit**

endeiknumi: to indicate (by word or act), to prove

Original Word: ἐνδείκνυμι

Part of Speech: Verb

Transliteration: endeiknumi

Phonetic Spelling: (en-dike'-noo-mee)

Short Definition: I show forth Definition: I show forth, prove.

HELPS Word-studies

1731 *endeíknymi* (from 1722 /*en* "in," which intensifies 1166 /*deiknýō*, "show") – properly, to make fully evident, showing *conspicuous proof* which

demonstrates something as *undeniable*. The prefix 1722 (*en*) adds the dimension of "abiding *condition*" making the "showing forth" on "*open display*" for all to see, i.e. *obvious* so "no one could miss it."

1731 /endeíknymi ("undeniably display") always occurs in the Greek middle voice which underlines the high level of personal interest shown by the one making something very evident.

[Such displaying then is always done with high personal involvement and sense of advantage.]

Strange statement

1. Pagan, Unbelievers has a warped view of God So men tend to think wrong of God

They conclude wrongly

- 1. because he has not judged, he wont judge
- 2. Because he has always forgiven, he always will
- 3. God is Love so he looks past your sins
- 4. God is not Just, or he would have judged

So since God does not immediately Judge sin We Believe God to be different than He is . SO We Rob him of his GLORY.
