Sermon: John 6:35

Union with Christ is essential to salvation.

We see:

- 1. The Bread of Life comes from heaven.
- 2. Union with Christ is through faith.
- 3. Eating and drinking Christ is union with Him through faith is His Word.

The church is called to be a confessing church, that she may be, *the pillar and ground of the truth* (1Tim. 3:15,16)

The Heidelberg Catechism

March 4, 2018; Malabar, FL Text: John 6:27-69; S.R.: Same

I AM THE BREAD FROM HEAVEN

INTRO: Dear Conregation: Among the central statements of "I AM" of Christ is the statement, "I am the bread of life, the bread that has come down from heaven." This is clearly a metaphor, a statement to be taken spiritually and not literally, especially when later in this chapter He adds the metaphor of eating His flesh and drinking His blood as part of the same metaphor. This idea of eating Christ as "bread" or even more shockingly of eating His flesh and drinking His blood speaks most dramatically about UNION with Christ as the basic necessity for our salvation. WE ARE WHAT WE EAT, what we eat becomes part of us and we become part of what we eat. IT is this spiritual union with Christ that is central to HOW faith in Christ saves us. By faith we are united to Christ so that what belongs to Him, His righteousness, is ours, and what belongs to us, our sin, then belongs to Christ in such a literal way that He can and does die for our sins. Since sin is spiritual and not physical evil, and so is forgiveness, we need to be spiritually united to Christ. Therefore the metaphor of eating and drinking fits very well to show us the necessity of being united to Christ, which we are told several times here in John 6, is accomplished by faith. NOW, just as the idea of Christ as our Shepherd begins in the Old Testament, so does union with another by eating and drinking also begin there. The children of Israel were given Mannah, bread from heaven, to sustain them during their wanderings in the wilderness, and that Mannah was a type, an OT picture of the true bread from heaven, who is Christ. Let us note: 1) Bread From Heaven that gives Life. 2) Union with Christ is what this is all about, and, 3) This union is created by faith in His words.

I. BREAD FROM HEAVEN THAT GIVES LIFE

A. THE OT MANNAH WAS A TYPE OF CHRIST

1. JOH 6:31 "Our fathers did eat manna in the desert; as it is written, He gave them bread from heaven to eat."

2. JOH 6:49 "Your fathers did eat manna in the wilderness, and are dead." 3. 1CO 10:3-4 "And did all eat the same spiritual meat; And did all drink the same spiritual drink: for they drank of that spiritual Rock that followed them: and that Rock was Christ."

B. CHRIST IS THE TRUE BREAD THAT COMES FROM HEAVEN

1. JOH 6:32 "Then Jesus said unto them, Verily, Verily, I say unto you, Moses gave you not that bread from heaven; but my Father giveth you the true bread from heaven."

C. THE TRUE BREAD GIVES ETERNAL LIFE

 JOH 6:35 "And Jesus said unto them, I am the bread of life: he that cometh to me shall never hunger; and he that believeth on me shall never thirst."
JOH 6:50 "This is the bread which cometh down from heaven, that a man may eat thereof, and not die. JOH 6:51 "I am the living bread which came down from heaven: if any man eat of this bread, he shall live for ever:

II. UNION WITH CHRIST THROUGH FAITH IS WHAT IS REPRESENTED HERE

A. THIS BREAD IS EATEN THROUGH FAITH

1. JOH 6:29 "Jesus answered and said unto them, This is the work of God, that ye believe on him whom he hath sent."

2. JOH 6:40 "And this is the will of him that sent me, that every one which seeth the Son, and believeth on him, may have everlasting life: and I will raise him up at the last day."

B. JESUS THEN ADDS A SECOND METAPHOR, EAT MY FLESH

1. JOH 6:51 "and the bread that I will give is my flesh, which I will give for the life of the world."

2. JOH 6:53-54 "Then Jesus said unto them, Verily, verily, I say unto you, Except ye eat the flesh of the Son of man, and drink his blood, ye have no life in you. Whose eateth my flesh, and drinketh my blood, hath eternal life; and I will raise him up at the last day."

C. THIS METAPHOR IS ALSO UNION WITH CHRIST

1. JOH 6:56 "He that eateth my flesh, and drinketh my blood, <u>dwelleth in me</u>, <u>and I in him</u>."

2. JOH 6:57 "As the living Father hath sent me, and I live by the Father: so he that eateth me, even he shall live by me."

III. UNION WITH CHRIST THROUGH FAITH IN HIS WORD

A. THE FLESH PROFITS NOTHING, THE SPIRIT MAKES ALIVE

1. JOH 6:63 "It is the spirit that quickeneth; the flesh profiteth nothing: the words that I speak unto you, they are spirit, and they are life."

2. The Jews were thinking like Roman Catholics or Lutherans, physically eating Christ somehow hidden in the bread, useless.

B, CHRIST IS TALKING ABOUT FAITH, A SPIRITUAL EXERCISE COMMUNICATED THROUGH WORDS!

1. JOH 6:63 "the words that I speak unto you, they are spirit, and they are life." 2. JOH 6:68 "Then Simon Peter answered him, Lord, to whom shall we go? thou hast the words of eternal life."

C. EATING AND DRINKING CHRIST IS DONE BY BELIEVING HIS WORDS

1. JOH 6:63-64A "the words that I speak unto you, they are spirit, and they are life, But there are some of you that believe not.

2. JOH 15:7 "If ye abide in me, and my words abide in you, ye shall ask what ye will, and it shall be done unto you."

CONCLUSIONS: Dear Congregation: Christ is the true mannah, the bread from heaven that feeds us unto eternal life. Christ is also the real sacrifice whose broken body and shed blood actually takes away sins. In order to be saved we must be united to Christ in these two particular aspects of His work. AND this union with Christ is accomplished only through faith, that is, ONLY through faith. BUT not just any kind of faith, faith in what HE says, faith in His words, a faith that is created in us by the Holy Spirit through the medium of Christ's words, because HE Himself says, "the words that I speak to you, they are spirit and they are life." Ignorance of the Bible, or twisting what it says, which are far more common than knowledge of the Bible today, won't do it. And there is no excuse for not making the Bible a large part of our lives, indeed as Job said, "I have considered your word more than my necessary food."
