Watch Seriously, Love Forgivingly, Befriend Tolerantly

I. To watch with seriousness

- 1Pe 4:7 But the end of all things is at hand: be ye therefore sober, and watch unto prayer.
- Mat 26:41 Watch and pray, that ye enter not into temptation: the spirit indeed *is* willing, but the flesh *is* weak.
- Luk 11:10 For every one that asketh receiveth; and he that seeketh findeth; and to him that knocketh it shall be opened...
- Luk 11:13 If ye then, being evil, know how to give good gifts unto your children: how much more shall *your* heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to them that ask him?
- Isa 55:6 Seek ye the LORD while he may be found, call ye upon him while he is near:
- Mar 13:35 Watch ye therefore: for ye know not when the master of the house cometh...
- Mar 13:36 Lest coming suddenly he find you sleeping.
- Mar 13:37 And what I say unto you I say unto all, Watch.

- Mat 25:5 While the bridegroom tarried, they all slumbered and slept....
- Mat 25:11 Afterward came also the other virgins, saying, Lord, Lord, open to us.
- Mat 25:12 But he answered and said, Verily I say unto you, I know you not.
- Mat 25:13 Watch therefore, for ye know neither the day nor the hour wherein the Son of man cometh.
- Son 5:2 I sleep, but my heart waketh: *it is* the voice of my beloved that knocketh, *saying*, Open to me, my sister, my love, my dove, my undefiled...
- Son 5:3 I have put off my coat; how shall I put it on? I have washed my feet; how shall I defile them?
- Son 5:4 ...my bowels were moved for him.
- Son 5:5 I rose up to open to my beloved...
- Son 5:6 I opened to my beloved; but my beloved had withdrawn himself, *and* was gone: my soul failed when he spake: I sought him, but I could not find him...
- Rev 3:20 Behold, I stand at the door, and knock: if any man hear my voice, and open the door, I will come in to him, and will sup with him, and he with me.
- 1Co 16:13 Watch ye, stand fast in the faith, quit you like men, be strong.
- 1Co 16:14 Let all your things be done with charity.
- 1Co 16:15 I beseech you, brethren, (ye know the house of Stephanas ...that they have addicted themselves to the ministry of the saints,)
- 1Co 16:16 That ye submit yourselves unto such, and to every one that helpeth with *us*, and laboureth.
- Rom 13:11 And that, knowing the time, that now *it is* high time to awake out of sleep: for now *is* our salvation nearer than when we believed.
- Tit 2:13 Looking for that blessed hope, and the glorious appearing of the great God and our Saviour Jesus Christ;
- 1Th 5:2 For yourselves know...that the day of the Lord so cometh as a thief in the night.
- 1Th 5:3 For when they shall say, Peace and safety; then sudden destruction cometh upon them, as travail upon a woman with child; and they shall not escape...
- 1Th 5:6 Therefore let us not sleep, as *do* others; but let us watch and be sober.

- Heb 10:24 And let us consider one another to provoke unto love and to good works:
- Heb 10:25 Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some *is;* but exhorting *one another:* and so much the more, as ye see the day approaching.

II. To love with forgiveness

1Pe 4:8 And above all things have fervent charity among yourselves: for charity shall cover the multitude of sins.

A. The urgency of fervent charity

- Col 3:14 And above all these things *put on* charity, which is the bond of perfectness.
- 1Ti 1:5 Now the end of the commandment is charity out of a pure heart...
- Joh 13:34 A new commandment I give unto you, That ye love one another; as I have loved you, that ye also love one another.
- Joh 13:35 By this shall all *men* know that ye are my disciples, if ye have love one to another.
- 1Pe 1:22 Seeing ye have purified your souls in obeying the truth through the Spirit unto unfeigned love of the brethren, *see that ye* love one another with a pure heart fervently:
- 1Co 13:1 Though I speak with the tongues of men and of angels, and have not charity, I am become *as* sounding brass, or a tinkling cymbal.
- 1Co 13:2 And though I have *the gift of* prophecy, and understand all mysteries, and all knowledge; and though I have all faith, so that I could remove mountains, and have not charity, I am nothing.
- 1Co 13:3 And though I bestow all my goods to feed *the poor*, and though I give my body to be burned, and have not charity, it profiteth me nothing.
- 2Pe 1:5 ...giving all diligence, add to your faith virtue; and to virtue knowledge;
- 2Pe 1:6 And to knowledge temperance; and to temperance patience; and to patience godliness;
- 2Pe 1:7 And to godliness brotherly kindness; and to brotherly kindness charity.
- 2Pe 1:8 For if these things be in you, and abound, they make *you that ye shall* neither *be* barren nor unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ.

B. Real love is accompanied by real forgiveness

- Pro 10:12 Hatred stirreth up strifes: but love covereth all sins.
- Pro 17:9 He that covereth a transgression seeketh love; but he that repeateth a matter separateth *very* friends.
- 1Co 13:4 Charity suffereth long, *and* is kind; charity envieth not; charity vaunteth not itself, is not puffed up,
- 1Co 13:5 ...seeketh not her own, is not easily provoked, thinketh no evil...
- 1Co 13:7 Beareth all things, believeth all things, hopeth all things, endureth all things.
- 1Co 13:8 Charity never faileth...
- Mat 18:21 Then came Peter to him, and said, Lord, how oft shall my brother sin against me, and I forgive him? till seven times?
- Mat 18:22 Jesus saith unto him, I say not unto thee, Until seven times: but, Until seventy times seven.
- Luk 7:41 There was a certain creditor which had two debtors: the one owed five hundred pence, and the other fifty.
- Luk 7:42 And when they had nothing to pay, he frankly forgave them both. Tell me therefore, which of them will love him most?
- Luk 7:47 Wherefore I say unto thee, Her sins, which are many, are forgiven; for she loved much: but to whom little is forgiven, *the same* loveth little.

III. To befriend without judgment

1Pe 4:9 Use hospitality one to another without grudging.

A. The importance of being open to receiving others — (Literally 'fond of guests')

- 1Ti 3:2 A bishop then must be blameless, the husband of one wife, vigilant, sober, of good behaviour, given to hospitality, apt to teach;
- Rom 12:13 Distributing to the necessity of saints; given to hospitality.
- Heb 13:1 Let brotherly love continue.
- Heb 13:2 Be not forgetful to entertain strangers: for thereby some have entertained angels unawares.

- Heb 13:3 Remember them that are in bonds, as bound with them; *and* them which suffer adversity, as being yourselves also in the body.
- Mat 25:35 For I was an hungred, and ye gave me meat⁽¹⁾: I was thirsty, and ye gave me drink⁽²⁾: I was a stranger, and ye took me in⁽³⁾:
- Mat 25:36 Naked, and ye clothed me⁽⁴⁾: I was sick, and ye visited me⁽⁵⁾: I was in prison, and ye came unto me⁽⁶⁾.
- Heb 13:16 But to do good and to communicate (share, social interaction, fellowship) forget not: for with such sacrifices God is well pleased.
- Pro 18:24 A man that hath friends must shew himself friendly...
- Luk 11:43 Woe unto you, Pharisees! for ye love the uppermost seats in the synagogues, and greetings in the markets.
- Luk 11:44 Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for ye are as graves which appear not, and the men that walk over *them* are not aware *of them*.

B. To be a friend without murmuring on the outside or judging on the inside

- 2Co 9:7 Every man according as he purposeth in his heart, *so let him give;* not grudgingly, or of necessity: for God loveth a cheerful giver.
- Php 2:14 Do all things without murmurings and disputings:
- Php 2:15 That ye may be blameless and harmless, the sons of God, without rebuke, in the midst of a crooked and perverse nation, among whom ye shine as lights in the world.

C. Jesus began His church on the principle of hospitality

- Luk 9:1 Then he called his twelve disciples together...
- Luk 9:2 And he sent them to preach the kingdom of God, and to heal the sick.
- Luk 9:3 And he said unto them, Take nothing for *your* journey, neither staves, nor scrip, neither bread, neither money; neither have two coats apiece.
- Luk 9:4 And whatsoever house ye enter into, there abide, and thence depart.
- Luk 9:5 And whosoever will not receive you, when ye go out of that city, shake off the very dust from your feet for a testimony against them.
- Luk 9:6 And they departed, and went through the towns, preaching the gospel...

D. The church that began with hospitality—Became hospitality

- Act 4:32 And the multitude of them that believed were of one heart and of one soul: neither said any *of them* that ought of the things which he possessed was his own; but they had all things common...
- Act 4:34 Neither was there any among them that lacked: for as many as were possessors of lands or houses sold them, and brought the prices of the things that were sold,
- Act 4:35 And laid *them* down at the apostles' feet: and distribution was made unto every man according as he had need.
