- The sin of people-pleasing doesn't merely consist in our heart's neglect of God, as in preferring some \_\_\_\_\_ to God.

  - <u>Isa 2.22</u> Stop regarding man in whose nostrils is breath, for of what account is he?
  - Jer 17.5 Thus says the Lord:

"Cursed is the man who trusts in man and makes flesh his strength, whose heart turns away from the Lord.

Psa 118.6, 8-9 The Lord is on my side; I will not fear.

What can man do to me?...

- 8 It is better to take refuge in the Lord than to trust in man.
- 9 It is better to take refuge in the Lord than to trust in princes.
- **Gal 1.10** For am I now seeking the approval of man, or of God? Or am I trying to please man? If I were still trying to please man, I would not be a servant of Christ.
- 1 Cor 4.3 But with me it is a very small thing that I should be judged by you or by any human court. In fact, I do not even judge myself.
- **Luke 14.26** "If anyone comes to me and does not hate his own father and mother and wife and children and brothers and sisters, yes, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple.

١.	Understand the essential nature of the sin of people-pleasing so that you can the extremes.
•	Ways in which we try to please people:
30	. Those who are in authority over us, such as parents, bosses, church leaders, overnment authorities, etc. must be honored, obeyed, and in the hings they require of us in the area of authority that God has given them over us.
	<b>Eph 6.1–2</b> Children, <b>obey</b> your parents in the Lord, for this is right. 2 " <b>Honor</b> your father and mother" (this is the first commandment with a promise),
	<b>Eph 5.22</b> Wives, <b>submit</b> to your own husbands, as to the Lord.
	<b>Eph 6.5</b> Bondservants, <b>obey</b> your earthly masters with fear and trembling, with a sincere heart, as you would Christ,
	<b>Heb 13.17 Obey</b> your leaders and submit to them, for they are keeping watch over your souls, as those who will have to give an account. Let them do this with joy and not with groaning, for that would be of no advantage to you.
	1 Pet 2.13–15a Be subject for the Lord's sake to every human institution, whether it be to the emperor as supreme, 14 or to governors as sent by him to punish those who do evil and to praise those who do good. 15 For this is the will of God,
	Rom 13.1 Let every person be subject to the governing authorities. For there is no authority except from God, and those that exist have been instituted by God.
	. We must lovingly, humbly, and genuinely seek to please people for their, order to lead an unbeliever to salvation or a believer to greater edification.
