Two Perspectives on Life

- 1. We can have a perspective that God is in control and ultimately working all things after the counsel of His own will
- 2. Or, we can leave God out of the picture and attempt to make sense of the circumstances of life purely from a humanistic perspective

What Happens When You Leave God Out of the Picture

- 1. It manifests in <u>pessimism</u>
- 2. It manifests in selfishness
- 3. It manifests in <u>bitterness</u>
- 4. It manifests in <u>fatalism</u>
- 5. It manifests in <u>worldliness</u>
- 6. If manifests in <u>fear</u>

Leaving God out of the picture brings ruin and heartache to life.

#1 PUT ON GOD'S GLASSES WITH REGARDS TO THE GRAVES SORROW (50:1-14)

A. The grave should remind us of the fragility of life

"I am to be gathered unto my people: bury me with my fathers in the cave that is in the field of Ephron the Hittite."

- B. The grace should remind us of the fruit of a godly testimony

#1 PUT ON GOD'S GLASSES WITH REGARDS TO THE GUILT OF SIN (50:15-18)

- A. When we doubt God's forgiveness we become fearful
- B. When we doubt God's forgiveness we become cowardly
- C. When we doubt God's forgiveness we become self-abasing

"He will turn again, he will have compassion on us; he will subdue our iniquities; and thou wilt cast their sins into the depths of the sea."

"Behold, for peace I had great bitterness: but thou hast in love to my soul delivered it from the pit of corruption: for thou hast cast all my sins behind thy back."
