His Own Did Not Receive Him

Luke 22:54-71 Pastor Phil Winfield March 8, 2015

He came to His own, and His own did not receive Him. Jn 1:11

Here's what happened:

- 1) Peter **<u>denied Him</u>** just like He said (v.54-62).
 - a. Denying Jesus is **incremental** (v.54).
 - i. First we **distance** ourselves from Jesus (v.54).
 - ii. Then we **<u>stand</u>** in the council of the ungodly (v.55).
 - iii. Then we act out of **fear** of our **peers** (v.56-60).
 - b. Restoring unfaithful believers is also **incremental** (v.60-62).
 - i. The **whistle blows** on our sin.
 - ii. We realize that the **Lord sees** all we do.
 - iii. We show true sorrow that leads to **<u>repentance</u>** and restoration.
- 2) Jesus was **beaten** just like He said (63-65).
 - a. They **mocked** him.
 - b. They **<u>blindfolded</u>** Him.
 - c. They **<u>beat</u>** Him.
- 3) The Leaders **<u>condemned</u>** him just like He said (v.66-71). We
 - a. Jesus First Trial was before Annas (Jn. 18.13-23.)
 - *b.* Jesus second trial was before **Caiaphas** (Matthew 26.57-66).
 - *c.* The third trial was before the **full body** of the Sanhedrin. (Lk 22.66-71).

What about when Jesus appears before you? What will you do with Jesus? *Jn 1:11 He came to His own, and His own did not receive Him.* <u>12</u> But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, to those who believe in His name: <u>13</u> who were born, not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God.
