I. A Special <u>Commendation</u> for a Special Sister

Synistēmi - to indicate <u>approval</u> of a person or event, with the implication that others adopt the same attitude; to recommend

Adelphé - a close female associate of a group with well-defined membership; <u>sister</u> in Christ, sister in the <u>faith</u>

Diákonos - one who executes the commands of another, esp. of a master, a servant, attendant, minister; the servant of a king
