2. The Admonition concerning Heavenl	ly Treasures	v. 20
(1) Treasures can be laid up in heaven!	"but lay up for yourselves treas where neither moth nor rust d and where thieves do not bre	lestroys
(2) Heavenly treasures are incorruptible, endu	ring, and forever secure!	

3. The Principle at Issue

"For where your treasure is, v. 21 there your heart will be also."

*The "locale" of one's treasure determines the "locale" of the heart!
*What one treasures captivates and shapes the heart!

(1) If my treasure is on earth, my heart will be earth-bound!

- Bound to this earth; ever seeking after things that corrupt and perish
- Seeking to secure such things in the futile attempt to make themselves secure.

(2) If my treasure is in heaven, my heart will be tasting of heaven!

- Such a one is truly free!
- Seeking that which endures
- Seeking that which is already secure by its very nature, and so can never be lost

What are the "heavenly treasures?"

- Ever deepening communion with God and Jesus Christ cf. vv. 4, 6, 18!!
- Fruits of righteousness which grow sweeter and sweeter cf. v. 33

How do I seek such heavenly treasure?

Seek Jesus Christ, communion with Him! vv. 1-18

- To do all as unto Him; seeking to please Him in all things
- To live before Him, bringing all things to Him
- To seek the priorities of His kingdom
