Psalm 118:27 (511)

In the Hebrew Bible (the ‘Masoretic text’) the Psalter is placed near the end of the Scriptures, probably because it was one of the last OT books to attain its final form. By the first century it had achieved that form, such that Jesus (Lu. 20:42) and Peter (Acts 1:20) could refer confidently to “the Book of Psalms.” Today, we explore the important issue of the ceremonial law in the Psalter – and the Person and Work of Christ whom they symbolized.
