Bless God for Securing You Ephesians 1:13-14

Reading: 1 Thessalonians 3:1-13

...pray...

John MacArthur began his commentary on this morning's text by remarking that men require *assurances* from one another...

And so we take solemn oaths,

Swear out affidavits,

Post surety bonds,

Pore over the *fine print* on *guarantees*,

Buy extended warrantees...

In an *earlier day* a man temporarily *surrendered* his *cloak* when borrowed from his neighbor, a *bond* that might be his *only protection* against the *cold night*.

Now when it comes to God, perhaps most would agree that His *promises*, alone, should be *enough* to satisfy us...

... but God gives us *more*!

God guarantees His most important promise with His seal & with His down payment! But, what exactly does that mean...?

Let's open our NT to Eph 1:3-14 (focus on vv.13 & 14).

That's all just one sentence & it's a long one!

Let's call it Paul's "Call to Worship" song, as he opens his letter to the Ephesians.

You can organize it into 3-stanzas:

#1 – The blessings by the *Father*. (3-6)

#2 – The blessings in the *Son* (7-12)

#3 – The blessings thru the *Holy Spirit*. (this morning – vv.13-14)

Every stanza ends with the phrase: ~ "to the praise of the glory of [God.]"

We've already examined $Stanza\ 1$ – the blessings of election & $Stanza\ 2$ – the blessings of redemption.

This morning we'll *drill down* on the *Stanza 3 – the blessing of spiritual security:*

The best blessings you have are sealed by the Holy Spirit!

- 1. When the Holy Spirit is given to every Christian (v.13).
- 2. What the Holy Spirit does for every Christian (vv.13 & 14).
- 3. Why the Holy Spirit is given to every Christian (v.14).

Paul praises God because God gives you the Holy Spirit the instant you trust in Christ!

- 1. In order to be *clear*, let's consider the question: *when* does every Christian *receive* the Holy Spirit...?
 - a. Paul's answer is, "at salvation." Read v.13
- 2. The apostle begins with a simple explanation of how a man or woman is saved:
 - a. *First*, he writes that there is a *message* that explains God's *plan of salvation*. Paul gives that message **two** related names: the *message* of truth & the *gospel* of your salvation.
 - i. The message of truth. The Bible's plan of salvation is completely true & it is the only truth that saves. It is the story of Jesus' life & death & resurrection, & Jesus said: "I am the way the truth and the life, no one comes to the Father but by Me."
 - ii. The Gospel of your salvation. "Gospel" means "good news" It is good news because all men & women are born estranged from God, they live in rebellion towards God, and they need a Savior! The good news is that Jesus saves!
 - b. *Secondly*, Paul clearly implies that the *Gospel message* must be *preached* (communicated). *Jesus* preached the Gospel, the *apostles* preached the Gospel, the *first deacons* preached the Gospel (Stephen), the *early church* preached the gospel. And the pagan, idol worshiping *Ephesians heard its promises*!
 - c. But *preaching* is not enough: v.13 says you have to *hear* the Gospel when it's *preached*. You know, that's really not as *simple* as it sounds! Bible teacher **Howard Hendriksen** points out there are different ways to hear, and *not every kind of hearing* leads to *believing*:
 - i. Some hear the message it so often their hearing (hearts) become *calloused*. Like pouring warm *water* on a cold *rock*.

- ii. Some hear it like a *lovely song* but don't get its real *point & power*. Like being so caught up in the *sound track* you don't pay attention to the *story line*.
- iii. Some hear but don't take the message *seriously*. They fail to grasp the serious reality of *death & the judgment* to come.
- iv. I look out from *this pulpit* on some Sunday mornings and I see people who I must say *don't seem to hear...*
- v. Jesus said to *be careful* how you hear. You are *responsible* to *turn* your ears to *hear* His story carefully.
- d. Paul also writes that *effective hearing* is accompanied by *believing*. Here is a *fundamental* gospel truth: the *good news* must be *believed* in order for you to be *saved*.
 - i. Paul's Greek term can be translated with several English words related to *belief*, *faith*, & *trust*.
 - ii. I like idea of *trusting* because is so clear. I can *tell* you this chair will hold you up. You *tell* me you believe me, but that doesn't require *much* of you. *Trust* implies you will *set your bottom* in this chair & rest *all your weight* on *these four legs...* and then I know you *really believe* me!
- e. The gospel is *preached*, *heard*, *trusted* ... and the *Holy Spirit* is given! (Spec., Paul says the *believer* is *sealed* we'll explore that more carefully in a moment.)
 - i. The best understanding of v.13's *grammar* is that *hearing* & *believing* the gospel & being *sealed* by God with the Holy Spirit *all happen at once*!
 - ii. Don't try to put too fine a point on the order of events!

But the apostle is concerned about more than when you receive the Spirit, the blessing is found in the Spirit's benefits!

- 1. At this point, let's *pause* in Paul's text and be *reminded* about *who* the Holy Spirit is:
 - a. First, don't forget that we are dividing the apostle's long sentence (3-14) into three *parts*: the *first* deals with God's blessing of *election*, the *second* with Jesus' blessing of *redemption*, & *now* this *third* part praises the Spirit's blessing of *sealing*. So the *Holy Spirit* is a part of the Trinity the three persons of God: *Father*, *Son* & *Spirit*.
 - b. And Paul says He is the *Holy Spirit*. *Holy* means *pure*, but *holy* also means *set apart* or *unique*. *Uniqueness* is the emphasis here. Among other things, He is *unique* because the *Spirit* is $God \rightarrow deity$!
 - c. **Finally**, you read (v.13b) He is the *Holy Spirit of promise*. In other words, this is the *same* Holy Spirit the OT prophets & then Jesus *promised* would come & live within the *apostles* (& *all* Christians), beginning at *Pentecost*, in fulfillment of the *New Covenant*.
- **2.** So back to **Eph 1:** (13.b) ...you were **sealed** in Him (→in Christ) with the Holy Spirit of promise who is given as a **pledge** of our inheritance, with a view to the redemption of God's own possession...
- **3.** Paul highlights **two** *benefits* of the Holy Spirit in the life of every believer: the Spirit *seals* & He serves as a *down payment*.
 - a. Again, v.13: *you were sealed* [in Christ] *with the Holy Spirit.* This is Paul's *main point* is today's text! One of God's *big ticket blessings* on every Christian is *sealing them with the Holy Spirit.* (PAUSE)
 - i. The Gr verb translated "sealed" has 4 related but distinct thoughts: security, authenticity, ownership, & authority.
 - ii. Security King Darius threw Daniel in the lions' den & sealed the opening so no one would free him. God seals you in Christ by His Spirit and no one dares tamper w/your relationship to Christ.

- iii. Authenticity The king's seal says this is a real royal decree. A notary's imprint says this is an authenticated document. God is both Father & notary & the Spirit serves as His seal, & the Spirit certifies that you are a genuine child of God!
- iv. Ownership Like a royal signet ring impressed into hot wax that seals the King's dispatch and says this document is from the King. The Holy Spirit signals that you belong to the King.
- v. *Authority* Every Christian is a *representative* of God; we operate under His *authority* (e.g. Great Commission's *mandate* to *preach* this gospel). The Spirit reminds us of Who we represent.
- 4. Do you know what *earnest money* is (*pause*)? It is a *down payment* on the *full price*. It is a *guarantee* that the *full price is coming*. Paul says the *Holy Spirit* is also your *down payment* on your *full inheritance* as child of the King!
 - a. **V.5** Paul blessed God for *predestinating* each believer to be *adopted* into God's family. Which leads to...
 - b. **V.11** As members of God's family you have an *inheritance* coming.
 - c. Now, **v.14** the Holy Spirit, living in you, is your *down payment* on your *future full inheritance*. He *assures you* that your *heavenly reward* is safe! In fact, He is a *foretaste* of your *heavenly inheritance*.
- 5. Of course, the **NT** teaches that the Holy Spirit does *much more* for God's children:
 - a. He is your (more slowly): helper (spiritual strength), advocate (accused), protector (attacked), encourager (faint), equipper (spiritual fruit), gift giver (serve church), comforter (sorrow & loss), guide (narrow way), assurer ("Abba, Father!")...and we can grow that list!
 - b. But Paul caps all the blessings of the Spirit w/ the two: God uses His Spirit to seal you in Christ (security, ownership, authenticity, authority) & God provides the Spirit as a down payment on your eternal inheritance! As good as it is to walk by the Spirit in this life, there is more to come! Both blessings (sealing, pledging) are experienced because the Holy Spirit now lives in you, never to leave.

What a *blessing*, Paul concludes! We are *blessed* by God's *gift* of the Holy Spirit!

- 1. Which brings us to the apostle's 3rd & concluding stanza marker: *to the praise of His glory*! We've seen this already in **vv. 7 & 12**; it ends each section of this *long & lovely* sentence: *to the praise of God's glory*.
- 2. So we receive the Holy Spirit & God receives the glory your praise.
- 3. "God's glory" is a way of summing up & thinking about all God is & all He's done. Here is what God has done in this morning's verses:
 - a. By the *Holy Spirit*, God has *guaranteed* that every one of His *children* (all who *trust Christ*) will be *arrive safely* at the *gates of Paradise*.
 - b. And when you *arrive*, your *inheritance*, as God's son/daughter, will be there *waiting* for you.
 - c. Blessed assurance, Jesus is mine!
 Oh, what a foretaste of glory divine!
 Heir of salvation, purchase of God,
 Born of His Spirit, washed in His blood.

This is my story, this is my song, Praising my Savior all the day long; This is my story, this is my song, Praising my Savior all the day long.

Beloved, you have the Holy Spirit, to the praise of the glory of His grace!

There are, perhaps, *uncountable blessing* for every Christian.

In *this* life...certainly in the *life to come*!

Yet Paul has dared to *identify* a few to *top his list* at the *beginning* of his *letter*:

First (vv.3-6) God's blessing of Election. In eternity past – before the foundation of the world – the Father lovingly chose you to adopt you into His royal family. Not because you deserved it, but because it pleased His kind intentions.

Second, the blessing (**vv.7-12**) of Redemption. On the cross, Jesus ransomed us from our enslavement to sin. He shed His blood to pay for His people's sins & purchase our forgiveness.

And one day, the sacrificed Lamb will be the exalted King, & every knee will bow & every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord to the glory of God the Father.

Finally, (vv.13&14), the blessing of the Holy Spirit. He lives in you to seal you. Y Christian, you are safely & securely in Christ! Your heavenly inheritance is safe!

Praise God from whom all blessings flow!

...pray...

Here is the gospel; please hear it carefully...:

...because you are a *sinner* & God is a holy yet loving, He sent His Son to *die* on the cross to *pay* for His people's sins.

...and then Jesus taken down from the cross & buried in a borrowed grave.

But on the 3rd day, God raised Jesus' to life, just as He promised!

Multiplied *hundreds* then witnessed the *resurrected* Son of God over a period of almost 6 *weeks* following His resurrection! ...

There! You've heard the message of truth! Have you believed...? Will you trust that Jesus' death is true...& that it is enough?

If so, may I speak w/ you about your new life in Christ?
