Sermon: "Samson All Ritual No Spirit" Pt.3- What's Wrong With You People? Pt. 42

I Text:

Old Covenant: *Judges 14:1-9*

New Covenant: *2 Peter 1:1-11*

II Doctrine:

The nature of a man must be guided by the Spirit of God, or destruction is the result. The same personality traits that allow us to enlarge God's kingdom, can also hinder it when not used fruitfully. Samson despite his physical strength, is defeated by the lust of the flesh.

God's sovereignty will supersede our failures in life, and his will shall be done anyway. The Lord will use the weakness of his imperfect vessel Samson to free Israel from the Philistines.
