THE WOEFUL WAY OF THE APOSTATES - PART 2

Jude 11

INTRODUCTION

- The "cargo cults" of the Pacific islands are characterised by a desire for material possessions and wealth.
- Much of modern day Christianity is possessed by the same covetous spirit.
- Balaam is something of an enigma.
- He prophesied the word of God, and delivered some of the most beautiful descriptions of Israel and the Messiah found in all of Scripture.
- Yet at the same time his heart was far from God and his counsel led to the deaths of thousands of Israelites.
- Ultimately he was executed and is now in hell.
- Balaam mentioned three times in New Testament:

Peter describes the *way* of Balaam (2 Peter 2:15-16) Jude describes the *error* of Balaam (Jude 11) Revelation describes the *doctrine* of Balaam (Revelation 2:14)

- Balaam represents the man whose heart is covetous and who sins in order to gain reward.
- He represents the man whose actions are evil, causing others to sin.

II. THE ERROR OF BALAAM

A. Covetousness

- "Ran greedily" to rush tumultuously without restraint.
- 2. Religion becomes a means to gain wealth (1 Timothy 6:5; Titus 1:10-11)
- B. Rebellion against God's will
 - 1. A way that is *perverse* (Numbers 22:32)
 - 2. A way that is *madness* (2 Peter 2:16)
- C. Forsaking God in the time of temptation
 - 1. Balaam's faith was tested and shown to be vain
 - 2. The test of a man's character is what it takes to stop him.
 - 3. The apostates of Hebrews 6 describe Balaam's condition (Hebrews 6:4-6)
- D. They are not what they claim to be
 - 1. He bore the title of *prophet* (Numbers 24:15-16; 2 Peter 2:16)
 - 2. God describes him as a soothsayer (Joshua 13:22)

E. Compromise with God's enemies

- 1. Christians do not form ties with those who hate God (2 Chronicles 19:1-2)
- Such people are not to be received into Christians' houses (2 John 10-11)

F. Causing others to sin

- This incident is recorded in Numbers 25, Balaam's involvement is found in Numbers 31:16
- 2. These false teachers will happily cause God's people to sin and bring them under God's chastisement, if it brings gain to themselves (Revelation 2:14)
- 3. They are *hirelings* who care not for the sheep (John 10:11-13)
- 4. It is spiritual fornication when God's people unite with the world (James 4:4)
- 5. Covetousness is idolatry (Colossians 3:5)

G. Ultimately judged for their sin

- He desired to "die the death of the righteous" (Numbers 23:10)
- 2. Yet he died as one of God's enemies (Numbers 31:8; Joshua 13:22)
- 3. God's severest judgments are upon those who cause others to sin (Matthew 18:6)

CONCLUSION

- 1. There are many people who have a form of religion, yet do not have Christ.
- 2. True Christianity is not comprised in outward forms and ceremonies but of the heart being brought to life and made new through the Holy Spirit (Galatians 6:15)
- 3. There are many Balaams in our day who love wealth and the sins of the flesh more than God.
- 4. We must be on our guard against such deceivers, lest we be led into fornication and idolatry and suffer the judgment of God (1 Corinthians 10:8,12).
