Biblical inerrancy

- Free from error in the original manuscripts.
- "Truth can and does include approximations, free quotations, language of appearances, and different accounts of the same event as long as those do not contradict." — James Montgomery Boice
- If the Bible contains errors, then we impugn the character of God.



- Variety in styles
- Different details of one event
- Variance from verbatim writing
- Variance in grammar usage
- Allowing problem passages
- No contradictions
- Reflecting into translations

- How could an error teach truth?
 - —Is it right or is it wrong?
- How could a holy God allow errors in His Word?
- Why doesn't everyone agree on what the "errors" are?
