



“It’s Supernatural”

*The Spirit Realm
Deuteronomy 18:1-11*

Working through:

I. Ministers – “to stand and minister” (vs. 1-5)

A concern for the:

- A. Legacy** – “all the tribe of Levi, shall have no part”
- B. Lord** – “the Lord is their inheritance”
- C. Laity** - “The first fruit...shall thou give”

II. Missionaries – “a Levite come from any of thy gates” (vs. 6-8)

A calling involving unique:

- A. Passion** - “come with all the desire of his mind”
- B. Places** – “unto the place which the Lord shall choose”
- C. Provision** – “they shall have like portions to eat”

III. Mystics – “makes his son... pass through fire” (vs. 9-14)

A contradiction of God’s :

- A. Standards** – “consulter with familiar spirits, or a wizard””
- B. Sovereignty** – “hearkened unto observers...and diviners”
- C. Sufficiency** – “thou shalt be perfect with the Lord thy God”
