A Culture of Dignity Exodus 21:12-27

Dignity requires:

I. Respect – "presumptuously...to slay with guile" (v. 12-17)

We esteem:

- A. Life "so that he die"
- B. Liberty "steals...sells him...be found in his hand"
- C. Leadership "he that curses his father or his mother"

II. Restitution - "he shall pay for the loss" (vs. 18-22)

We experience damage due to:

- A. Arguments "if men strive together"
- B. Anger "if a man smite his servant"
- C. Accident -"If men strive, and hurt a woman with child"

III. Retribution - "he shall be surely punished" (vs. 22-27)

We endure curtailed:

- A. Life "thou shalt give life for life"
- B. Limits "burning for burning"
- C. Labor "let him go free for his eye's sake"

Sentence Sermon:

"Because human beings are made in the image of God, we are to love them by treating them with honor and dignity."
