To Tell the Truth

Nehemiah 9:1-37

Meanwhile... Back in Jerusalem

- ❖ Nehemiah 9 gives us a full-blown picture of the nature of confession
 - tell the truth about God, His nature, character and being
 - tell the truth about ourselves and our sin
- * Recap
 - the great scene of national revival in Nehemiah 8
 - hearing God's Word stirs deep emotion and causes people to weep and mourn because of their sin
 - no, no, no.... the joy of the LORD is your strength
 - people resolve to get back on track with doing things God's way

The Setting

- ❖ Three signs that people are ready to "do business" with God
 - fasting

- sackcloth
- dirt on their heads
- The people listen once again to an extended reading of God's Word (3 hours)
 - once again, the Word pricks their hearts
 - the Word leaves the people with two lasting impressions
 - the greatness of God
 - their own failure to live for God's glory
- ❖ A prolonged period of confession (another 3 hours)

Confession

- Our limited understanding of "confession"
- Confession is a wonderful and awesome thing
 - it is not browbeating ourselves or self-flagellation
 - it is acknowledging what is true about God and what is true about ourselves
- ❖ Hebrew word for confession used in Nehemiah 9 = "to give praise, thanks, or glory"
 - to confess is to worship
 - many of the great worship experiences portrayed in Scripture are accompanied by times of deep, heartfelt, worshipful confession
- ❖ To confess means "to tell the truth"

- ❖ Nehemiah 9:6-37 is an extended prayer
 - directs the people's thoughts to the goodness and power of God
 - prepares them to appeal to God for His mercy in the midst of their own condition of distress
- The prayer
 - adores God for His great mercy and forgiveness
 - acknowledges the repeated failure and multiplied iniquities of Israel
 - celebrates God's ongoing ministry of reconciliation
- The prayer is extremely well-crafted
 - who did all that hard work of preparation, shaping, and writing this out in advance?
 - possibly Ezra?
 - the value of written prayers
- The prayer is stunning in its scope and vision
 - a rich summary of Biblical history from Creation right up through the time of Nehemiah
 - Abraham, the Exodus, giving of the Law at Sinai, the wilderness wanderings, the Conquest, the period of the Judges, the Assyrian deportation and the Babylonian exile
 - the interweaving of the twin themes of God's promise and God's judgment throughout Israel's history
 - alternation between admission of sin & the acknowledgment of God's gracious character & actions

Confession Today

- ❖ We live in a society that minimizes and ignores sin
 - nationally
 - personally
- ❖ Playing the blame game (my genes, upbringing, "It's just the way I am")
 - is it the way God <u>wants</u> you to be?
 - we measure our sin against the nature and character of God, not against each other
- ❖ 2 Chronicles 7:14, humble yourself, pray, seek God's face, turn from your wicked ways
 - God WILL hear from heaven
 - God WILL forgive your sin
