WLC Q. 129. What is required of superiors towards their inferiors? A. It is required of superiors, according to that power they receive from God, and that relation wherein they stand, to love, pray for, and bless their inferiors; to instruct, counsel and admonish them; countenancing, commending, and rewarding such as do well; and discountenancing, reproving, and chastising such as do ill; protecting, and providing for them all things necessary for soul and body: and, by grave, wise, holy, and exemplary carriage, to procure glory to God, honor to themselves, and so to preserve that authority which God hath put upon them. **WLC Q. 72.** What is justifying faith? A. Justifying faith is a saving grace, wrought in the heart of a sinner, by the Spirit and Word of God, whereby he, being convinced of his sin and misery, and of the disability in himself and all other creatures to recover him out of his lost condition, not only assenteth to the truth of the promise of the gospel, but receiveth and resteth upon Christ and his righteousness therein held forth, for pardon of sin, and for the accepting and accounting of his person righteous in the sight of God for salvation.

WCF Chapter 22, Of Lawful Oaths and Vows. 4. An oath is to be taken in the plain and common sense of the words, without equivocation or mental reservation. It can not oblige to sin; but in any thing not sinful, being taken, it binds to performance, although to a man's own hurt: nor is it to be violated, although made to heretics or infidels [2 Samuel 21:1]. **WLC Q 113.** What are the sins forbidden in third commandment? ... all sinful cursings, oaths, vows, and lots; violating of our oaths and vows, if lawful; and fulfilling them, if of things unlawful. **WLC Q 144.** What are the duties required in the ninth commandment? ... keeping of lawful promises. **WLC Q 151.** What are those aggravations that make some sins more heinous than others? ... if against means, mercies, judgments, light of nature, conviction of conscience, public or private admonition, censures of the church, civil punishments; and our prayers, purposes, promises, vows, covenants, and engagements to God or men.

- I. God covenants with underserving people (Gen. 10:6-20, 15:12-21, 48:20-22)
- II. God is longsuffering toward sinful men (Gen. 15:16)
- III. God will destroy His enemies (Gen. 15:16)
- IV. God will bless His people at the expense of His enemies (Gen. 15:17-21)
- V. God overturns the work of His enemies to benefit His people (Gen. 48:22)
- VI. God hears the prayers of His people (Ex. 3:7-8)
- VII. God warns His people against idolatry (Ex. 23:23-33, Deut. 7:1-6)
- VIII. God is sovereign (Deut. 20:10-18)
- IX. God makes a clear distinction between His people and His enemies
