I. THE CAUSE OF RUTH'S CHOICE AND CONFESSION

- A. Tribute to whom tribute is due: the cause is Godøs (Rom. 9:16)
 - 1. Ruth clave unto Naomi (Ruth 1:14b) is an admirable act of faith
 - 2. This young womangs faith equals Abramgs, Mosesg, Daniel and his friends
 - 3. Yet admiration is misplaced when we admire her/them: it belongs to God!

II. THE CONTRAST OF RUTH'S CHOICE AND CONFESSION

- A. Ruthøs choice and confession stands in contrast to Orpahøs
 - 1. There are outward similarities between Ruth and Orpah
 - 2. Orpah wasnot a hypocrite: *she returned to what she didn't leave* a. she missed the ÷change of heartø Jesus spoke about (John 3:5)

III. THE COST OF RUTH'S CHOICE AND CONFESSION

- A. Her choice is summed up in five words but it involves a fierce fight (14b)
 - 1. It involved severing tender affections: (8)
 - 2. It involved a trial of reason: vs. 11-13
 - 3. It involved sacrifice of dear friend: vs. 15
- B. Following Christ involves denying yourself: yet every loss for Him is gain!

IV. THE CONTENT OF RUTH'S CONFESSION

- A. The prefaces to her confession is intense and conscious: *Intreat me not to leave thee, or to return from following after thee*
- B. Ponder the five aspects of her confession
 - 1. She renounces her freedom to choose her own path: *for whither thou goest, I will go!*
 - 2. She resolves always to be in good company: and where thou lodgest, I will lodge; thy people shall be my people
 - 3. She desires to have and cling to Naomiøs God: thy God be my God
 - 4. She commits to a life-long commitment: where thou diest, will I die, and there will I be buried.
 - 5. She solemnly vows her sincerity: the LORD do so to me, and more also, if ought but death part thee and me.

FINALLY ...

- A. Dongt rest in this beautiful confession: she went on to be Boaz's wife!
 - 1. Be found on Jesusøfield
 - 2. Lay yourself at Jesusøfeet
 - 3. Plead Jesus to take you as His!
