Our Resurrection Treasure
1 Peter 1:3-6
Reading: Luke 23:44-46; 24:1-8

Bethany Baptist Church April 12, 2020 (Easter)pray...

In the **NT's** *Letter to the Colossians*, the Apostle Paul offers this exhortation to Christians (3:2): *Set your mind on things above*, *not on the things that are on earth.*

That might **not** sound much like an *Easter verse* to you...!

But my concern is that in this current season of *pandemic* and *recession* and *social* distancing and the constant barrage of bad news...

...the Church could lose track of "things above" and become overwhelmed by "things on earth."

And this *trial* we all face could suck the *joy* and *hope* right out of your *soul* and your *Resurrection worship*!

Let me *assure* you this morning that **God** is still *on His throne* and **Christ** is still *risen from the grave...*

And our gracious and merciful God has blessed us in the resurrection of His Son!

Please join this Resurrection Sunday in the NT *Letter of <u>1 Peter</u>*. My Easter text is from <u>1:3-6</u> - a Gospel greeting that celebrates God's goodness.

Peter wrote this letter to be *circulated* among a string of churches in modern day *Turkey*.

Suffering and persecution were just on the horizon.

People needed a strong dose of hope, distilled in a pure formula of gospel truth!

Peter *makes his point* immediately: **God** *blesses* and *protects* His children through the *resurrection* of **Jesus**, His Son. I'll *outline Peter's message* like this:

Five truths that Easter calls you to remember:

- 1. Remember your God (3).
- 2. Remember your rebirth (3).
- 3. Remember your inheritance (4,5).
- 4. Remember Christ's resurrection (3).
- 5. (Conclusion): Never forget your joy (6).

Is this too simple (?): You can't celebrate Easter without celebrating God! Blessed God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.

- 1. Peter's *celebration salutation* is so emphatic that it's a little difficult to translate, but Peter's *point* is to *point us to our great God* in the midst of our *greatest trials*!
 - a. **I.e.,** to remind us of *who* God is, and *what* He's done for us.
- 2. The apostle's **first** reminder is that our **God** is the Father of our **Savior**.
 - a. We are so *thankful* that Jesus' teachings *underlined* for us that our *Creator* is also our *Heavenly Father*...
 - b. But the point *here* is that *first*, God is the *Father* of our Lord Jesus.
 - i. That *reminds* us of the biblical *Doctrine of the Trinity*; that God exists eternally as *Father*, *Son*, and *Spirit*.
 - ii. And so it reinforces Jesus' *deity*: if God is Jesus' Father then the *Son* has the *Father*'s divine nature. *Jesus is God*!
 - c. And Peter joyfully honors our Savior with His *full Gospel title*: the *Lord Jesus Christ*.
 - i. As *Lord* He is our *master*...our *boss*.
 - ii. As *Jesus* we hear His *human name* (angels/parents), a reminder that He is the *Incarnate* God, the *Word become flesh*, *truly* God, and *truly* man.
 - iii. And as *Christ* Jesus is the long *promised*, long *anticipated Messiah-King* of *Israel* ... and the *world*.

- 3. This *Resurrection Day* we remember that *our* God, *who is our Father because He is first the Father of our Lord*, is *merciful* and *gracious*.
 - a. To have *mercy* is to have *pity* and *compassion* on someone who is in a *desperately low condition*.
 - b. Make **no** mistake, friend, when you *compare* yourself to God, God is way above your pay-grade in every imaginable way!
 - i. Here's how God puts it (Isa 55:9): "For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are My ways higher than your ways and My thoughts than your thoughts."
 - c. Multiply that *spiritual distance* by the reality of our *spiritual poverty* (Isa 64:6):
 - i. For all of us have become like one who is **unclean**, and all our righteous deeds are like a **filthy garment**; and all of us wither like a leaf, and our iniquities, like the wind, take us away.
 - ii. Unclean, unrighteous, ... withered, and wind-struck!
 - d. You & I need mercy...God is merciful!
- 4. Indeed, God is "great in mercy," and motivated by mercy, God acts in grace.
 - a. "Grace" is rooted in the idea of a gift. Something good we **didn't** earn or deserve.
 - b. But here is a more developed definition of grace: "Grace is the undeserved favor God pours on you, simply because He loves you, and that favor from God results in your spiritual life & spiritual health." (2X)

Bros/sis, the *ultimate outpouring* of God's *mercy* and *grace* is your *rebirth* (3): "according to His great mercy, God has caused us to be born again to a living hope."

- **1.** I just read from **Isa** that all of us are born spiritually *unclean*, *unrighteous*, *dying* and *doomed*. You can *add* to that *sad diagnosis* (**NT**): "you were dead in your trespasses and sins!"
 - **a.** We need *mercy*, we need *hope*, we need a *new life*!
- 2. In the Gospel of John (3), *an aging Jewish teacher* named *Nicodemus* came to Jesus, searching for the *way to heaven*.
 - a. Jesus *immediately* offered the answer, then said it *again*:
 - b. "You must be born again!" 2X
- 3. Your need is **not** to *rewind* your life or to *retread* your soul, you need a *new life*. You need to be *spiritually born again* by the power of the *Holy Spirit*, because of the *mercy* of God through *faith* in Jesus Christ.
 - a. "You must be **born again!**" is the most important instruction you'll ever hear, and Jesus further explained it like this:
 - b. "...whoever believes [in the Son of Man] will have eternal life."
 - c. And then Gospel writer immediately *underlined* Jesus' words with the world's most beloved promise (3:16): "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life."
 - d. Resurrection Sunday *trumpets that truth* that our great God is saving God, a God of *life* ... *life everlasting*!

- 4. Peter then goes on to bind *spiritual rebirth* to *living hope*.
 - a. We are living in a *season of history* in which, for many, *hope* is *blighting* on the *vine* ... the victim of *pestilence*.
 - b. But God's gift of *new life in Christ* offers *eternal hope* for all who *turn* to Him and *trust* in Him.
 - c. Here is the substance of that <u>hope that lives</u>, even when threatened by death; hope means...
 - i. The certainly of God's *complete forgiveness* of *all your sins* (so a *clear conscience*).
 - ii. Your new identity as God's child (rebirth; adoption).
 - iii. The experience of a supernaturally & conspicuously *new way* of *feeling, wanting, thinking, speaking* and *acting*.
 - iv. The *assurance* in **this** life that you will *enter heaven* in the **next** *life...* The Bible promises that you can know that *now*!
 - v. And when you arrive in *heaven*, God's guarantee of an *unimaginably fabulous inheritance* an *incalculable spiritual treasure!*

There is a treasure waiting for you in heaven! God's "born again" children are adopted into His family to receive an eternal inheritance. Read v.4, 5.

- 1. Our *inheritance* is a part of the *living hope* we just read about in **v.3.**
- 2. An *inheritance* is what *fathers* prepare to bless their *children*. The Christian's *inheritance* is the *blessings* that come with *new life*, **especially** the blessings we'll enjoy in *heaven*:
 - a. Here is a foretaste of your inheritance: heavenly dwelling, heavenly city, no sin, no suffering, no mourning, uncountable fellowship, unimaginable worship, angels!, ... the presence of Jesus forever!
- 3. We've seen **this month** how *financial disaster* can *drop through the roof* like a *meteor* and *smash* all our careful attempts to build a *good life*, a *comfortable retirement* and a *handsome estate*.
 - a. But the **NT** writer **James** has already warned us that **this** *life* is *like* a *vapor*...
 - b. Yet Peter goes to great lengths to assure you that **nothing** can *smash* the *eternal inheritance* God has *prepared* and *protects* for His children (*that's us*!).
 - c. He *triple-dips* the guarantee! The *inheritance* God has for you is *imperishable*, *undefiled*, & *unfadable*...
 - i. *Imperishable* won't *diminish* or *disappear*. Jesus promised that when your *treasure* is in *heaven*, it is safe from *moth* & *rust*!
 - ii. *Undefiled* Originally *to paint, to stain* → *to corrupt w/ moral stain.* But everything in *heaven*, incl. your *inheritance* is *perfect* and *pure*!
 - iii. *Unfadable* The Gr. word α μαρ αν τον pictured a beautiful flower that **never** faded...**never** lost its beauty. Beloved, I can promise, heaven will **never** lose its beauty...**never** grow boring!

- 4. Your inheritance is *reserved* in heaven. It will be waiting for you. It won't expire like a **30-**day coupon!
 - a. Peter's grammar is great here! The Gr. verb "reserved" is in the Gr. perfect tense: that indicates a past action w/ ongoing results.
 - b. God *prepared* and *reserved* your inheritance for you in the *past*, and He's *kept* it *reserved* ever since!
- 5. Consider *this*, beloved: if God is going to all this trouble to **guard** *your inheritance*, He **isn't** going to **lose** *you*! **Read v.5.**
 - a. When God wrote your name in the *Lamb's Book of Life*, He wrote it w/ *indelible ink*! You are His *today*, and heaven is *secure*!
 - b. Does God use a *safe*, locked in a *vault*, hidden in a *volcano* to protect your *salvation*...? **No!** He uses your *faith* to *guard* your *salvation*.
 - i. "Guarded/kept/secured" (5) was a military term, and Peter's present-tense grammar assures you that God is **always** on duty, securing your salvation.
 - ii. Just how powerful is God? Omnipotent all powerful; "Almighty" → E.g. Designed, created and still sustains all that is. Judged to world in the flood (worse than a pandemic). Lead Israel out of Egypt across the parted Red Sea and into the Promised Land. Raised Jesus from the dead on the third day! Christian, that kind of power guards your inheritance!
 - iii. And Almighty God **loves** your *faith*. We were *saved* **by** faith and we are *kept* **through** faith.
 - 1. But is your faith genuine? → Trust only in Jesus? Does it bear biblical fruit? Is it assured by the Holy Spirit...?
 - 2. ... Then it's the kind of faith God requires! The *Thief on the Cross* made a last minute *reservation* w/ the *currency* of *desperate faith*, and that was *good enough* for Jesus! "This day you will be w/ Me in Paradise."

If your faith is the Risen Christ, eternal life & an eternal inheritance are yours!

Peter has celebrated the blessings of: mercy, grace, rebirth, hope, inheritance, eternal security ... but how did God do it all?

- 1. Let's rewind back to **v.3**: through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead (2X). All of these blessings are possible because God raised Jesus from the grave!
 - a. *Here is Easter*! Peter <u>sources</u> his entire list of blessings with these **two** Easter truths: the <u>death</u> of Jesus & the <u>resurrection</u> of Jesus.
 - b. Jesus spoke of His *crucifixion*, long before He *struggled* up Calvary: "the Son of Man came ... to give His life a ransom in the place of many."
 - i. That means that as Jesus *died* on the cross He was *paying* for the sins of His people.
 - c. And Christ had also previewed His *resurrection* from the outset of His ministry: "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up!"
 - i. Jesus' resurrection is God's assurance that He has accepted Jesus' payment on the cross.
 - ii. The *resurrection* is also God's *assurance* that Jesus' followers will *live forever*.
 - iii. Our Lord said (Jn 11:25-26) I am the resurrection and the life, He who believes in Me will live even if he dies...."
 - iv. The Apostle Paul wrote (1 Cor 15): But now Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who are asleep.
- 2. The *crucifixion & resurrection* of Jesus are the *fruit* of God's *mercy*.
- 3. The *crucifixion & resurrection* provide the *basis* for our *rebirth*.
- 4. The crucifixion & resurrection give us a living hope.
- 5. The *crucifixion* & *resurrection* qualify us for our *inheritance*.
- 6. The crucifixion & resurrection anchor our assurance.
- 7. **Jesus'** *crucifixion* & *resurrection* fuel our *faith*.

This Resurrection Day, I have good news... truth you can find hope in: Christ the Lord is risen today!

When your Resurrection Sunday celebrations are over, and you wake up Monday morning...

The world will still be battling the virus.

The *economy* will still be *staggering*.

The *community* will still be *under its restrictions*.

But you can still have joy! Read v.6.

Peter wrote to churches that faced all kinds of *trials*, including *persecution* and *death*.

He reminded them that their trials wouldn't last forever.

He taught them that, in God's wisdom, their trials were necessary (\rightarrow purpose).

But *first* He called them to **remember** God's *mercy*, **remember** their *blessings*, **remember** their *hope* ... and **remember** Jesus Christ, *raised from the dead*!

In this (no matter what else is going on) ... you greatly rejoice!

He is risen!

...pray... We praise you, Father, for the gift of your Son.

That in Your mercy & grace You sent Him to die in the place of sinners.

Then by Your power you raised Him to life.

And by faith in Jesus You guarantee eternal life and an eternal inheritance.

Thank you for loving us.

In the name of the risen Lord Jesus Christ, Amen!

Jesus (Jn 14:27): "Peace I leave with you; My peace I give to you; **not** as the world gives do I give to you. **Do not let** your heart be troubled, **nor** let it be fearful."
