"THE GREAT TIME OUT" I COR 10:6, 11-13; DEU. 28; JEREMIAH

- I. THE BIBLE IS GOD'S PERSONAL ACCOUNT OF WHO HE IS AND HOW HE ACTS 1 Cor 10:6,11-13
 - A. The Bible is not a dictionary, theology text book, science journal, or topical reference book
 - B. It is a centuries-running, progressive revelation of who He is and how He behaves told mostly in a story form that can be remembered. It is written, compiled and edited by holy men of God who spoke as they were moved and guided by the Holy Spirit
 - C. He selected a people, Israel, through whom He would reveal Himself. The Old Testament through the book of Acts is His dealings with Israel and those nations with whom they came in contact.
 - D. The Old Testament has great value as history and as an example book for all the world to read and learn 1 Cor 10:13

II. AN EXAMPLE FROM THE OLD TESTAMENT WITH APPLICATIONS TO TODAY

- A. God's promises to Israel, His covenant people Deut 28:3-14; 15-24
 - 1. <u>Blessing</u> for obedience vv. 3-14
 - 2. Curses for disobedience vv. 15-24
 - a. Location, food source, children, stock
 - b. Cursing, confusion and rebuke
 - c. Plague, fever, inflammation, sword, climate changes, invasion, captivity

- B. The Babylonian Exile of Judah
 - 1. Judah's provocation brings prophets' predictions Jeremiah speaks
 - a. Multiple breaches of the covenant
 - b. God reveals His position but mercifully and graciously offers restoration if heeded; a first <u>time out</u> given
 - c. The call to repentance rejected; they did not want to halt their way of life;
 - d. An invasion from Babylon is on its way
 - e. When prayer is of no value and His word is hated
 - f. Surrender is the best option Jer 21:3-10
 - g. Invasion comes and it is horrible
 - h. Lesson not learned 2 more times!!
 - i. Captivity is on
 - 2. How long will it last and why?
 - a. The grace of God Jeremiah 29:1-14
 - b. Time out for 70 years for those who were taken captive; loss of life and privilege
 - c. The 70 years were determined as a year for each 7 year sabbatical for the land that was missed; determined for the abuse of the land 2 Chron 36:15-21
 - 3. What were they to do in the time out? Jer 29:5ff
 - a. Build houses and live in them
 - b. Marry and have children
 - c. Pray for the peace of the city
 - 4. God's promise to them Jer 29:10-14
