LORD'S DAY 13 (John 3:16,18 Romans 14:8)

BLESSEDNESS OF THE TRUTH: GOD'S SON IS OUR LORD

Intro: We have seen the beauty and significance of our Savior's names: Jesus and Christ. Now we press on to see the names "Only begotten Son" and "Lord".

-Some translations of the Bible say "only Son" or "one and only Son". Is this true? Does not God have many other sons and daughters?

-How is the sonship of Jesus Christ unique? How do we become sons of God? What is the blessedness of Christ's lordship?

Songs:

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I. THE CONFESSION OF JESUS' UNIQUE SONSHIP

- A. His origin.
 - 1. Jesus is not called the son of God because he was the first creature, as Jehovah Witnesses teach.
 - 2. He is not called the son of God because he was born of a virgin. His origin did not begin at Bethlehem.
 - 3. He is not called the son of God because of his life or death, or resurrection. Son of God is not just a title given to him.
 - 4. He is God the Son! Begotten of the Father, he shares his father's divine nature. He is very God, second person of Trinity!
 - 5. Only in this way can we confess, "I believe in Jesus Christ, the only begotten Son..." We worship him.
- B. He is the only begotten of the Father! WE read this six times in the Bible, in the writings of the Apostle John.
 - 1. While God has many other children, Jesus Christ is the *only* one begotten. There is only *ONE* divine Son.
 - 2. **Begotten**, not made. The Father produces the Son who has life in himself (John 5:26).
 - 3. Begotten means to partake of the being of another, to come out of another's being. He is God's *natural* son. (John 10:30).
 - 4. Eternal Son: He was always with the Father and the Father sent forth his Son (Gal.4:4).
- C. The testimony of this truth confessed:
 - 1. Old Testament prophets call him the mighty God, the everlasting Father, the man that is God's fellow...
 - 2. The shepherds and wise men came, bowed down, and worshipped him..
 - 3. The Apostles proclaim him: "We beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father..."
 - 4. Christ says, "he that hath seen me, hath seen the Father. I and my Father are one."
 - 5. God's testimony: "This is my beloved Son in whom I am well pleased."
- D. The importance of this blessed confession.
 - 1. If you do not believe this, you do not have true saving faith. You cannot be saved. Faith is believing that Jesus is God.
 - 2. Only as God could he in his birth become Immanuel, God with us.
 - 3. Only as God does his death on the cross have meaning. He was able to bear awful wrath of God in our place.
 - 4. Only as God is he mighty to save and to apply to us the benefits of his cross and resurrection.
 - 5. As God, his love never changes, but he is faithful.

II. THE CONFESSION OF OUR SONSHIP

- A. Believers are also children of God "for his sake".
 - 1. We are children not by virtue of creation, not because we are worthy, not in ourselves, and surely not the whole race.
 - 2. By the fall of Adam and our nature, we are children of wrath, children of the devil!
 - 3. But God chose us eternally in Christ to be his dear sons and daughters.
 - 4. God in time purchased our sonship by the precious blood of his only begotten Son.
 - 5. Experientially we know our selves as children of God by the testimony of the Christ's Spirit in us crying "Abba, Father".
- B. We are children of God by adoption
 - 1. Christ not only did a great work for us, but h does a great work in us.
 - 2. We are given a new heart and a new life, born from above.
 - 3. We are given faith: "For ye are all the children of God by faith in Christ Jesus (Gal.3:26)."
 - 4. God has taken us who were no children and included us in his family, sons and daughters.
 - 5. God enables us to conduct ourselves as children of God, children of light, fighting sin and walking in obedience.
- C. We are children as a **fruit of God's grace**.
 - 1. What blessedness that the Lord chooses and adopts us as children. Undeserved & particular favor. For who are we?
 - 2. Were we not debtors to the law and righteousness, slaves to Satan and sin, enemies of God?
 - 3. All that we can say is that it is all of God's irresistible grace!
- D. Implications:
 - 1. This sonship makes us different from the rest of humanity. There is not a great brotherhood of mankind.
 - 2. This is not a matter of sinful pride or boastfulness. But the fact is that we are made separate from the world.
 - 3. Wonderful comfort: god is my Father, Jesus my elder brother, the angels our servants, heaven our home, church family.

III. THE CONFESSION OF JESUS' LORDSHIP

- A. How is Jesus Christ our Lord?
 - 1. He is Lord by virtue of the fact that he is the Son of the living God. He is God.
 - 2. He is Lord by virtue of his salvation, by virtue that he has purchased us with his precious blood from all our sins.
 - 3. He owns us, posses us, therefore he has a great responsibility for us.
- B. He is the Lord over a very happy people.
 - 1. He cares for us feeding us with his Word.
 - 2. He rules and governs us so that we are not unruly or disobedient.
 - 3. He protects us so that not one of God's children is lost.
 - 4. We are content with ourselves and our path in life, not caught up in self-pity or rebellion when our path is difficult.
- C. We have a great responsibility towards him.
 - 1. "Our Lord": not merely a confession of the lips, but we acknowledge that we are his in our life.
 - 2. We humbly devote ourselves to serve and worship him, body and soul.
 - 3. How can we show this? Let my tongue, my actions, and my life be as a continual offering of praise to him.
