  - 1) Licentiousness.
  - 2) Self-Centeredness (Phil 2:4)
- **D.** Motivations for encouragement
  - 1) Avoiding all appearance of sin allows us to avoid actual sin.
  - 2) Christians will indeed suffer, so let us suffer for the sake of righteousness (1 Pt 2:15, 20)
  - 3) Consider the perfect example of our Saviour (1 Pt 2:21-22)
- **E.** Uses from the Text
  - 1) Be ready and willing to receive correction with humility.
  - 2) Cut off all actual sin, not just the appearance of sin.
  - **3)** Put on holiness.
  - 4) Develop a sensitive conscience to sin.
  - **5)** Be encouraged, dear Christian, that in heaven, we shall be free not only from all appearance of sin, but all presence of sin.
