Note the repeated Sentence: "For all this his anger is not turned away, but his hand is stretched out still." (9:12.17.21. 5:25: 10:4: 14:27)

God stretched out his hand in wrath to send punishment & judgment.

Compare: Moses hands being lifted up in war (Exodus 17:8-16)

- * God hates sin, and is relentless in His holy wrath against it.
- I. The Lord will <u>completely</u> judge <u>PRIDE</u> (9:8-12)

- II. The Lord will <u>suddenly</u> judge <u>REBELLION</u> (9:13-17)
 - A. Rebellious <u>Disregard for God</u> (v.13)
 - B. Rebellious <u>Leadership</u> (lies & false teaching) (v.14-16)
 - C. Rebellious <u>Hypocrisy</u> (v.17a)
 - D. Rebellious Lifestyles (v.17b)
 - E. Rebellious <u>Talk</u> (v.17c)
- III. The Lord will severely judge WICKEDNESS (v.9:18-21)

IV. The Lord will <u>righteously</u> judge <u>INJUSTICE</u> (10:1-4)

Conclusion: While God's hand is stretched out against the wicked to keep them under His relentless wrath (Jn. 3:36), God's hands are also extended to offer grace, forgiveness and reception (see: Isaiah 65:1-2; Compare Rom. 10:21)
