2 - Abraham's Sons by Faith

Galatians 1 Galatians 2

Gal. 2:11 But when Cephas came to Antioch, I opposed him to his face, because he stood condemned. **12** For before <u>certain men</u> came from James, he was eating with the Gentiles; but when they came he drew back and separated himself, fearing the circumcision party. **13** And the rest of the Jews acted hypocritically along with him, so that even Barnabas was led astray by their hypocrisy. **14** But when I saw that their conduct was not in step with the truth of the gospel, I said to Cephas before them all, "If you, though a Jew, live like a Gentile and not like a Jew, how can you force the Gentiles to live like Jews?"

Gal. 2:15 We ourselves are Jews by birth and not Gentile sinners; **16** yet we know that a person is not justified by works of the law but through <u>faith</u> in Jesus Christ, so we also have believed in Christ Jesus, in order to be justified by faith in Christ and not by works of the law, because by works of the law <u>no one</u> will be justified. **17** But if, in our endeavor to be justified in Christ, we too were found to be sinners, is Christ then a servant of sin? Certainly not! **18** For if I rebuild what I tore down, I prove myself to be a transgressor. **19** For through the law I died to the law, so that I might live to God. **20** I have been crucified with Christ. It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me. **21** I do not nullify the grace of God, for if righteousness were through the law, then Christ died for no purpose.

Gal. 5:6 For <u>in Christ Jesus</u> neither <u>circumcision</u> nor <u>uncircumcision</u> counts for anything, but only <u>faith</u> working through love.

Gal. 6:15 For neither <u>circumcision</u> counts for anything, nor <u>uncircumcision</u>, but a <u>new creation</u>.

Gal. 3:1 O foolish Galatians! Who has bewitched you? It was before your eyes that Jesus Christ was publicly portrayed as crucified. **2** Let me ask you only this: Did you receive the Spirit by works of the law or by hearing with faith? **3** Are you so foolish? Having begun by the Spirit, are you now being perfected by the flesh? **4** Did you suffer so many things in vain—if indeed it was in vain? **5** Does he who supplies the Spirit to you and works miracles among you do so by works of the law, or by hearing with faith— **6** just as Abraham "believed God, and it was counted to him as righteousness"?

Gal. 3:7 <u>Know then</u> that it is those of faith who are the sons of Abraham.

Gal. 3:8 And the Scripture, foreseeing that God would justify the <u>Gentiles</u> by faith, preached the gospel beforehand to Abraham, saying, "In you shall all the nations be blessed."

Gal. 3:9 So then, those who are of faith are blessed along with Abraham, the man of faith.

Gal. 3:10 For all who rely on works of the law are under a curse; for it is written, "Cursed be everyone who does not abide by all things written in the Book of the Law, and do them." 11 Now it is evident that no one is justified before God by the law, for "The righteous shall live by faith."
12 But the law is not of faith, rather "The one who does them shall live by them." 13 Christ redeemed us from the curse of the law by becoming a curse for us—for it is written, "Cursed is everyone who is hanged on a tree"—14 so that in Christ Jesus the blessing of Abraham might come to the Gentiles, so that we might receive the promised Spirit through faith.

Gal. 3:15 To give a human example, brothers: even with a man-made <u>covenant</u>, no one annuls it or adds to it once it has been ratified. **16** <u>Now the promises were made to Abraham and to his offspring. It does not say, "And to offsprings," referring to many, but referring to one, "And to your offspring," who is Christ. **17** This is what I mean: the law, which came 430 years afterward, does not annul a covenant previously ratified by God, so as to make the promise void. **18** For if the <u>inheritance</u> comes by the law, it no longer comes by promise; but God gave it to Abraham by a promise. **19** Why then the law? It was added because of transgressions, <u>until the offspring</u> should come to whom the promise had been made, and it was put in place through angels by an intermediary. **20** Now an intermediary implies more than one, but God is one.</u>

Gal. 3:21 Is the law then contrary to the promises of God? Certainly not! For if a law had been given that could give life, then righteousness would indeed be by the law. **22** But the Scripture imprisoned everything under sin, <u>so that the promise by faith in Jesus Christ might be given to those who believe</u>. **23** Now <u>before faith</u> came, we were held captive under the law, imprisoned until the <u>coming faith would be revealed</u>. **24** So then, <u>the law was our guardian until Christ came, in order that we might be justified by faith</u>.

Gal. 3:25 But now that <u>faith</u> has come, we are no longer under a <u>guardian</u>, **26** <u>for in Christ Jesus</u> <u>you are all sons of God, through faith.</u>

John 1:11 He came to his own, and <u>his own people did not receive him</u>. **12** But to all who did <u>receive him, who believed</u> in his name, <u>he gave the right to become children of God</u>, **13** who were born, <u>not of blood</u> nor of the will of the <u>flesh</u> nor of the will of man, <u>but of God</u>.

Gal. 3:27 For as many of you as were <u>baptized into Christ have put on Christ</u>.

Gal. 3:28 There is <u>neither Jew nor Greek</u>, there is neither <u>slave nor free</u>, there is no <u>male and</u> <u>female</u>, for you are <u>all one in Christ Jesus</u>. **29** And <u>if you are Christ's, then you are Abraham's</u> <u>offspring</u>, heirs according to promise.

2 – Abraham's 2 Sons

Gal. 4:4 But when the fullness of time had come, God sent forth his Son, born of woman, born under the law, **5** to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as sons. **6** And because you are sons, God has sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying, "Abba! Father!" **7** So you are no longer a slave, but a son, and if a son, then an heir through God.

Gal. 4:21 Tell me, you who desire to be under the law, do you not listen to the law? **22** For it is written that Abraham had two sons, one by a slave woman and one by a free woman. **23** But the son of the slave was born according to the flesh, while the son of the free woman was born through promise.

Gal. 4:24 Now this may be interpreted allegorically: these women are <u>two covenants</u>. One is from <u>Mount Sinai</u>, bearing children for slavery; she is Hagar. **25** Now Hagar is Mount Sinai in Arabia; she corresponds to the <u>present Jerusalem</u>, for she is in slavery with her children. **26** But the <u>Jerusalem above</u> is free, and she is our mother.

Gal 4:28 Now you, brothers, like Isaac, are children of promise.

Gal. 4:29 But just as at that time he who was born according to the <u>flesh</u> persecuted him who was born according to the <u>Spirit</u>, <u>so also it is now</u>.

Gal 4:30 But what does the <u>Scripture</u> say? "<u>Cast out the slave woman and her son, for the son of the slave woman shall not inherit with the son of the free woman.</u>" **31** So, brothers, we are not children of the slave but of the free woman.

John 8:31 So Jesus said to the Jews who had <u>believed</u> him, "If you abide in my word, you are <u>truly</u> my disciples, 32 and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." 33 They answered him, "We are offspring of Abraham and have never been enslaved to anyone. How is it that you say, 'You will become free'?"

John 8:34 Jesus answered them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, everyone who practices sin is a <u>slave</u> to sin. 35 The slave does not remain in the house forever; <u>the son remains forever</u>. 36 So if <u>the</u> <u>Son</u> sets you free, you will be free indeed. 37 <u>I know</u> that you are <u>offspring of Abraham</u>; <u>yet</u> you seek to kill me because my word finds no place in you. 38 I speak of what I have seen with my Father, and you do what you have heard from your father."

John 8:39 They answered him, "<u>Abraham is our father</u>." Jesus said to them, "<u>If you were</u> <u>Abraham's children</u>, you would be doing the works Abraham did, **40** but now you seek to kill me, a man who has told you the <u>truth</u> that I heard from God. This is not what Abraham did. **41** You are doing the works <u>your father</u> did." They said to him, "We were not born of sexual immorality. We have one Father—even God." **42** Jesus said to them, "<u>If God were your Father</u>, <u>you would</u> <u>love me</u>, for I came from God and I am here. I came not of my own accord, but he sent me. **43** Why do you not understand what I say? It is because <u>you cannot bear to hear my word</u>. **44** <u>You</u> <u>are of your father the devil</u>, and <u>your will is to do your father's desires</u>. He was a murderer from the beginning, and does not stand in the truth, because there is no truth in him. When he lies, he speaks out of his own character, for he is a liar and the father of lies. **45** But because I tell the truth, you do not believe me. **46** Which one of you convicts me of sin? If I tell the truth, why do you not believe me? **47** <u>Whoever is of God hears the words of God</u>. The reason why you do not hear them is that you are not of God."

John 8:48 The Jews answered him, "Are we not right in saying that you are a Samaritan and have a demon?"

John 8:49 Jesus answered, "I do not have a demon, but I honor my Father, and you dishonor me. 50 Yet I do not seek my own glory; there is One who seeks it, and he is the judge. 51 Truly, truly, I say to you, <u>if anyone keeps my word, he will never see death</u>." 52 The Jews said to him, "Now we know that you have a demon! <u>Abraham died</u>, as did the prophets, yet you say, 'If anyone keeps my word, he will never taste death.' 53 <u>Are you greater than our father Abraham</u>, who died? And the prophets died! Who do you make yourself out to be?" 54 Jesus answered, "If I glorify myself, my glory is nothing. It is my Father who glorifies me, of whom you say, 'He is our God.' 55 But you have not known him. I know him. If I were to say that I do not know him, I would be a liar like you, but I do know him and I keep his word. 56 Your father Abraham rejoiced that he would see my day. He saw it and was glad." 57 So the Jews said to him, "You are not yet fifty years old, and have you seen Abraham?" 58 Jesus said to them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, <u>before Abraham was, I</u> am." 59 So they picked up stones to throw at him, but Jesus hid himself and went out of the temple.

Gal. 6:15 For neither circumcision counts for anything, nor uncircumcision, but a <u>new creation</u>. **16** And as for all who walk by this rule, peace and mercy be upon <u>them</u>, and <u>upon the Israel of God</u>.
