Memory Verse: Proverbs 31:30

Day 1: Read 2 Chron. 30:1-11 and discuss: "Remnant" is seen throughout Scripture. What is the importance of this theme? How does it connect to an application from this passage regarding reaching out to others? What does it mean: "Expectations shape experience"? How do you identify your expectations without being either unrealistically optimistic or depressingly pessimistic? What Scripture would you bring to bear to help you shape expectations?

Day 2: Read 2 Chron. 30:1-11 and discuss: If there *is* a remnant, how should that direct our evangelism? What does a "wide net" look like for you, in your daily life?

Day 3: Read 2 Chron. 30:1-11 and discuss: What are some obstacles to people believing the gospel? How would you go about explaining the gospel in such a way that people respond to the message and not to the messenger? What about your own attitude? In what ways are you an obstacle to people believing the gospel?
