



GOD IS JUST

God cannot ignore sin; the full penalty for violations of law must be paid.

GOD IS JUSTIFIER

God justifies the guilty; He acquits men of their sins and declares them innocent.

GOD IS JUST AND THE JUSTIFIER

God sent Jesus to pay the penalty for the guilty who could not; it was the just for the unjust. This satisfies the demands of the law for punishment so God can be just and also be the justifier of all that

believe in Jesus.



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
1. He Offered a Sinless Sacrifice
