## Question # 195 What Do We Pray for in the Sixth Petition?

**Answer:** In the sixth petition, (which is, And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil,<sup>a</sup>) acknowledging, that the most wise, righteous, and gracious God, for divers holy and just ends, may so order things, that we may be assaulted, foiled, and for a time led captive by temptations;<sup>b</sup> that Satan,<sup>c</sup> the world,<sup>d</sup> and the flesh, are ready powerfully to draw us aside, and ensnare us;<sup>e</sup> and that we, even after the pardon of our sins, by reason of our corruption,<sup>f</sup> weakness, and want of watchfulness,<sup>g</sup> are not only subject to be tempted, and forward to expose ourselves unto temptations,<sup>h</sup> but also of ourselves unable and unwilling to resist them, to recover out of them, and to improve them;<sup>i</sup> and worthy to be left under the power of them;<sup>j</sup> we pray, that God would so over-rule the world and all in it,<sup>k</sup> subdue the flesh,<sup>l</sup> and restrain Satan,<sup>m</sup> order all things,<sup>n</sup> bestow and bless all means of grace,<sup>o</sup> and quicken us to watchfulness in the use of them, that we and all his people may by his providence be kept from being tempted to sin;<sup>p</sup> or, if tempted, that by his Spirit we may be powerfully supported and enabled to stand in the hour of temptation;<sup>q</sup> or when fallen, raised again and recovered out of it,<sup>r</sup> and have a sanctified use and improvement thereof:<sup>s</sup> that our sanctification and salvation may be perfected,<sup>t</sup> Satan trodden under our feet,<sup>u</sup> and we fully freed from sin, temptation, and all evil, for ever.<sup>v</sup>
