The SPECIAL PRAYERS OF THE CHURCH

Elder: In peace let us pray to the Lord:

The LORD'S PRAYER

Our Father, Who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy Name, Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Reader: On this Fifth Sunday of Easter and as we continue our journey through God's Narrative of earth's history our Old Testament reading comes from the book of Genesis, the thirty-second chapter beginning with the twenty-second verse.

The OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

Genesis 32:22-28

²² The same night he arose and took his two wives, his two female servants, and his eleven children, and crossed the ford of the Jabbok. ²³ He took them and sent them across the stream, and everything else that he had. ²⁴ And Jacob was left alone. And a man wrestled with him until the breaking of the day. ²⁵ When the man saw that he did not prevail against Jacob, he touched his hip socket, and Jacob's hip was put out of joint as he wrestled with him. ²⁶ Then he said, "Let me go, for the day has broken." But Jacob said, "I will not let you go unless you bless me." ²⁷ And he said to him, "What is your name?" And he said, "Jacob." ²⁸ Then he said, "Your name shall no longer be called Jacob, but Israel, for you have striven with God and with men, and have prevailed."

Reader: This is the Word of our Lord!

Congregation: Thanks be to God!

THE INTRODUCTION TO THE HOLY GOSPEL

Reader: *In our Gospel reading this morning, Jesus uses a parable to teach His disciples and us a lesson about being persistent. Please rise out of respect and reverence for the words of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and as we join together in singing the triple alleluia.*

C: Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia!

Reader: The Gospel according to St. Luke, the eighth chapter, beginning with the first verse:

Cong.: Glory be to Thee, O Lord!

The HOLY GOSPEL

Luke 8:1-8

And he told them a parable to the effect that they ought always to pray and not lose heart. ² He said, "In a certain city there was a judge who neither feared God nor respected man. ³ And there was a widow in that city who kept coming to him and saying, 'Give me justice against my adversary.' ⁴ For a while he refused, but afterward he said to himself, 'Though I neither fear God nor respect man, ⁵ yet because this widow keeps bothering me, I will give her justice, so that she will not beat me down by her continual coming.'" ⁶ And the Lord said, "Hear what the unrighteous judge says. ⁷ And will not God give justice to his elect, who cry to him day and night? Will he delay long over them? ⁸ I tell you, he will give justice to them speedily. Nevertheless, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?"

Reader: *This is the Gospel of the Lord.*

C: Praise be to Thee, O Christ!

The APOSTLES CREED (LSB p. 192)

All: I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth.

And in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, Who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty. From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.
