#### Definition #2

 It is the use of sanctified imagination to develop a sensory (sight, sound, taste, touch, smell) understanding of a section of Biblical text.


 When the Biblical text gives us descriptions or even clues about the sights and sounds of the text ... it's our job to make that sensory connection for ourselves first and our congregations after that.

Danger #2: Looking for sensory clues in order to make yourself look clever.


Danger #3: This is NOT the first step in your study of a text.



- **STEP 1:** Read the text. Read the text. Read before the text. Read after the text. Read everything related to the text.
- **STEP 2:** Strongly consider repeating Step 1.

- STEP 6: What does it sound like?
- STEP 7: Keep yourself in check.
