

- When you think of the messages you've heard preached, what percentage comes from the Prophets?
 - The 17 books of the Old Testament prophets account for 25% of our 66 Biblical
 - By word count (in original languages) they account for 20% of the Bible.



Preaching The Prophets

- The prophets ministered in times of:
 - Political intrigue
 - National uncertainty
 - Unrestrained materialism
 - Rampant selfishness
 - Moral indifference
 - Social injustice



Three Reasons To Preach The Prophets:

- Their message reverberates with our own society.
- The fulfilled prophecies give us assurance of God's Sovereignty and Jesus as Messiah.
- Their unfulfilled prophecies proclaim the future glory of Messiah Jesus.



Preaching The Prophets

Three Specific Terms For Prophets:

וביא NABIY

The vast majority of times (over 300), this Hebrew word is used for these men. The primary meaning of the word is to speak, especially as a spokesman on behalf of another.



Exodus 7:1-2

And the LORD said unto Moses, See, I have made thee a god to Pharaoh: and Aaron thy brother shall be thy **prophet**. Thou shalt speak all that I command thee: and Aaron thy brother shall speak unto Pharaoh, that he send the children of Israel out of his land.

Preaching The Prophets

Three Specific Terms For Prophets:

הזה CHOZEH

is a less common word used to describe sight, with the idea of perception and/or understanding.

Preaching The Prophets

Preach Them Contextually

- Setting
 - 1) Pre-exilic Israel: Jonah, Joel, Amos, Hosea, Isaiah, Micah
 - **2) Pre-exilic Judah:** Nahum, Zephaniah, Habakkuk, Jeremiah
 - 3) Exilic: Daniel, Obadiah, Ezekiel
 - 4) Post-exilic: Haggai, Zechariah, Malachi



Preaching The Prophets

Preach Them Contextually

- Each writer is unique:
 - Hebrews 1:1
 - Isaiah walked around naked 3 years as a symbol of humiliation of coming exile
 - Ezekiel in captivity built a little model of Jerusalem and laid siege to it
 - Jonah gets swallowed by a great fish and then goes and preaches to Nineveh smelling like fish
 - Hosea had to marry a prostitute who constantly left him

Preach Them Connectively

- · Connected to other prophets
 - Sometimes these prophets are contemporaries of one another and it is especially interesting how God uses different methods for the same message.
 - Example: Haggai and Zechariah



Preaching The Prophets

Preach Them Connectively

- Connected to Deuteronomy 28-30
 - These chapters of Moses' final message lay out in clear details the covenant God made with His people Israel.
 - The prophets are continually hearkening back to Deuteronomy 28-30.



Preaching The Prophets

Preach Them Connectively

- Connected to the New Testament witness
 - When an inspired New Testament writer quotes a prophet, he has the authority to interpret that passage. The Bible acts as its own commentary.

Isaiah 61:1-2

The Spirit of the Lord GOD is upon me; because the LORD hath anointed me to preach good tidings unto the meek; he hath sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and the opening of the prison to them that are bound; To proclaim the acceptable year of the LORD, and the day of vengeance of our God; to comfort all that mourn;

Preach Them Christologically

- The prophets promise:
 - reuniting of Israel and Judah
 - a new covenant of changed hearts
 - a righteous, healing sunrise
 - · light to enlighten the Gentiles
 - a return of social and moral obedience
 - · a suffering servant of God who bears our sins
 - a king coming in glory
 - the great and terrible day of the Lord



Acts 3:17-26

- 17 And now, brethren, I wot that through ignorance ye did it, as did also your rulers.
- 18 But those things, which God before had shewed by the mouth of all his prophets, that Christ should suffer, he hath so fulfilled.
- 19 Repent ye therefore, and be converted, that your sins may be blotted out, when the times of refreshing shall come from the presence of the Lord;
- 20 And he shall send Jesus Christ, which before was preached unto you:
- 21 Whom the heaven must receive until the times of restitution of all things, which God hath spoken by the mouth of all his holy prophets since the world began.

Acts 3:17-26

- 22 For Moses truly said unto the fathers, A prophet shall the Lord your God raise up unto you of your brethren, like unto me; him shall ye hear in all things whatsoever he shall say unto you.
- 23 And it shall come to pass, that every soul, which will not hear that prophet, shall be destroyed from among the people.
- 24 Yea, and all the prophets from Samuel and those that follow after, as many as have spoken, have likewise foretold of these days.
- 25 Ye are the children of the prophets, and of the covenant which God made with our fathers, saying unto Abraham, And in thy seed shall all the kindreds of the earth be blessed.
- 26 Unto you first God, having raised up his Son Jesus, sent him to bless you, in turning away every one of you from his iniquities.
