## Preach the Word; be instant in season, out of season; reprove, rebuke exhort with all longsuffering and doctrine.

## All Scripture is given by the inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for instruction in righteousness: that the man of God may be perfect, throughly furnished unto all good works.

After prayer and reading

Start with the Text
Stay with the Text
Say what the Text says
Stop where Text stops

Preparing Sermons: Start To Finish

In too many sermons, the Text is like the *National Anthem at a ballgame*!

Voiced at the beginning, but never heard from again.

Preparing Sermons: Start To Finish

Something is going to "*drive*" your message...

- Either it will be the Text
  - or your own agenda
    - or your own idea.
- or simply, just what YOU want to say.

Start by asking questions of the Text. (Who/What/When Where/Why) <SGB

3. Print the Text
This is where I will ...

- Mark up the Text

(looking for repeated words/strong verbs/difficult portions/connect thoughts

- Do word studies.
- Cross References
- Start thinking about illustrations



## Preparing Sermons: Start To Finish

4. Re-read the Text.
Read passage in numerous translations.
Exercising Caution, but using every tool in the tool shed.



## Preparing Sermons: Start To Finish

Then and only then...

Read what others have written.Start with study Bibles and work your way up to commentaries.

- Use sermonaudio or other tools to listen how others have handled this passage.



I would highly encourage you NOT to wait till Saturday to start this process...
Start as early in week as possible. So you have time to meditate on Text.

## Preparing Sermons: Start To Finish

- 6. Determine the primary point of the Passage.
  - What's the BIG IDEA?
- What is the author seeking to convey from this one Text?
- There should be a single CENTRAL truth that Holy Spirit is teaching.

## Preparing Sermons: Start To Finish

### 7. Write a Thesis statement

- This is a vital and irreplaceable step in sermon preparation.
- After determining the BIG IDEA of the passage, write a proposition statement.
- Everything you develop should flow from that single idea.
- Too many sermons, have no clear discernable point.

## Preparing Sermons: Start To Finish

Having written a concise and understandable thesis statement...
8. Determine your TITLE.
The title should be a simple summation of the thesis

summation of the thesis.

(this may sound elementary...but)

- 9. Start formulating your work into an outline.
- Find the "points of the sermon" from your exegetical work.
- A formal manuscript outline is best. Even if you do not take it into the pulpit.

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## Preparing Sermons: Start To Finish

In other words, why does this truth matter?

- How does it apply to the hearers?
- What relevance does it have to where I am in life?

- 10. Develop accurate Application.
- Let the points of the passage determine what application you make.

Remember, at the end of the day we are dealing with people right where they are.

## Preparing Sermons: Start To Finish

### Illustration ...

Every serious athlete must sharpen his/her skills and continually strive to improve .. so too should the man of God.
The professional golfer must constantly develop his swing.
The basketball player must practice their shot over and over again.
The major league pitcher must throw thousands of pitches to stay sharp.

How much more important is it, for those who deal in eternal matters – to be sure they are striving to do their very best?!

- THE preacher must study, and give himself fully to learning the Word of God so that he might rightly divide the Word of Truth.

This takes commitment and determination, but our goal should be to constantly improving.



## Preparing Sermons: Start To Finish

- 12. Write and rewrite your outline. Clean it up.
  - Don't be a data dump.
- Do not try and relate every single thing you learned while studying.
   (The church doesn't need to know how to parse every Greek verb in the Text.)



You are nearly done and ready to preach...

### THE GOSPEL ?!?!

How does this passage relate to the Gospel?

What does this Text teach us about Christ?

About salvation? About God? About Eternity?

"The motto of all true servants of God must be, 'We preach Christ; and him crucified.' A sermon without Christ in it is like a loaf of bread without any flour in it. No Christ in your sermon, sir? Then go home, and never preach again until you have something worth preaching."
