B. Suffering for Christ is the badge of discipleship!
Christ had to suffer to enter into his glory. We who follow "in his steps" and live godly will also suffer. Paul came to terms with this the day he was saved (Acts 9:16) and, with Peter, taught this "the normal Christian life" (Phil. 1:29; 3:8; 1Thess. 2:14; 1Pet. 2:21; 3:18; 4:1). If we minister to sufferers we will never lack an audience.

Application: Jesus is our Wonderful Counselor, Wounded Healer and Burden Bearer *par excellence*. We can #Jesus, follow Him and minister to members in our church in 3-4 ways:

- Aim to restore and comfort one another (2Cor. 13:11).
- Encourage or exhort one another everyday (Heb. 3:13).
- Bear one another's <u>burdens</u> due to life's hardships (Gal. 6:2).
- Show solidarity with the suffering saints globally (1 Pet. 5:9).

Discuss in what specific ways do we do this? Determine to start here and now!

## **INTRODUCTION**

**A.** In today's society, we "follow", post and tweet nearly everything, but are we pursuing the only One who calls us to follow him with our entire lives?

"6 As you therefore have received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk in Him.

7 rooted and built up in Him and established in the faith, as you have been taught, abounding in it with thanksgiving."

Colossians 2:6-7

C. TEXT: Colossians 1:21-2:3 (Pew Bible/Pg. 205/New Test.)

## **FOLLOWING JESUS IN MINISTRY**

Paul uses the conclusion of a hymn to address believers at Colossae. Once they were outsiders, strangers, evil doers and God's enemies (1:21). "But now" because of Jesus' death (the Cross) and resurrection (Easter) they are reconciled to God *and* to one another (1:22). They are to be holy, blameless, beyond reproach and minister to and serve one another in love.

The proof that God reconciled them (past tense) was evident in their continuing in *the* faith (present tense). The faith necessary to reconcile them, by nature is "steadfast" causing them to cling to and persevere in "the hope of the Gospel" (future, 1:5, 23). So, genuine faith *in Christ* leads to faithfulness to Christ. Every member is meant to be a minister serving Christ and one another! This is only possible when we follow *Jesus!* Why and how must *Christ*ians minister?

- I. FOLLOWING JESUS IN MINISTRY = SELFLESS SERVICE TO OTHERS:
  - A. The word "minister" means to "serve" others. Jesus is the Head of his body, the church. He is her sovereign Lord and the supreme authority over every member. Yet Jesus did not come to be served but to serve and give his life a ransom (Mk. 10:45). Jesus went about preaching, teaching and healing so these three aspects of ministry must characterize his followers (Matt. 9:35-38).

- Paul was "made a minister" (1:23, 25) and exhorted people to imitate him even as he imitated Jesus. At conversion, he was assured of his call to serve Jesus by being a witness to people (Acts 9:15). This service involved taking Jesus' name to the Gentiles, proclaiming of the Gospel. Like Jesus and Paul, all followers are anointed and sent to evangelize the lost and edify the saints.
- What Paul did (ministry) for others stemmed from who Paul was (a servant of Christ). Many had not seen Paul's face in the flesh (physical, no Gnostic ideology). Yet he took a personal interest in their welfare (4:7-18). He hoped to see Philemon (1:22) then visit believers in Laodicea. His ministry, a stewardship from God, was "for your sake/ benefit". Epaphras, the founder, he called a fellow-servant and faithful servant (1:7-8). Every member must be a minister in their church!
- II. FOLLOWING JESUS IN MINISTRY = SHARING IN JESUS' SUFFERINGS:
  - A. Note words that describe Paul's work (1:29).

    Ministry is hard labor, toil, struggle, a lot of energy.

    Yet in this he discovered Jesus' purpose and the Spirit's power. He rejoiced in his sufferings for taking the Gospel to the Gentiles, now part of a "mystery" church! (26, 27). He considered this, "filling up what was lacking in Christ's afflictions" (1:24). So, was Christ's suffering insufficient for our salvation? No! Christ suffered on the cross once-and-for-all as the Lamb of God to take away sins. Believers like Paul share in the persecutions of Jesus' body, the church.
