Stephen Wellum:

The question of the identity and nature of the church is an issue that the NT wrestles with at length in light of Christ's finished work. Because our Lord fulfilled the OT in his life, death, and resurrection and thus inaugurated the new covenant era, the question of the identity of his people is raised. Is Jesus' new community merely the continuation of Israel, hence a Jewish community that Gentiles may now join as long as they come under the demands of the old covenant? Or, is it more of a Gentile community, divorced from Israel of old, a kind of replacement of Israel? Or, is it, as I argue below, neither Jewish nor Gentile but a third entity—a new humanity—organically related to the dawning of the new creation and the new covenant age? 1 - Ephesians - New Humanity

Eph. 1:1 Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, To the <u>saints</u> who are in Ephesus, and are faithful <u>in Christ Jesus</u>: **2** Grace to you and peace from <u>God our Father</u> and the Lord Jesus Christ. **3** Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us <u>in Christ</u> with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places,

Eph. 1:4 even as he <u>chose us in him</u> before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and blameless before him. In love **5** he <u>predestined us</u> for <u>adoption</u> to himself <u>as sons</u> through Jesus Christ, according to the purpose of his will, **6** to the praise of his glorious grace, with which he has <u>blessed us</u> in the Beloved.


Eph. 1:7 <u>In him we</u> have <u>redemption</u> through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of his grace, **8** which he lavished upon <u>us</u>, in all wisdom and insight **9** making known to <u>us</u> the <u>mystery of his will</u>, according to his purpose, <u>which he set forth in Christ</u> **10** as a plan for the fullness of time, to unite all things in him, things in heaven and things on earth.

Eph. 1:11 In him we have obtained an inheritance, having been predestined according to the purpose of him who works all things according to the counsel of his will, **12** so that we who were the first to hope in Christ might be to the praise of his glory. **13** In him you also, when you heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and believed in him, were sealed with the promised Holy Spirit, **14** who is the guarantee of our inheritance until we acquire possession of it, to the praise of his glory.

Eph. 1:15 For this reason, because I have heard of your <u>faith in the Lord Jesus</u> and your love toward all the <u>saints</u>, **16** I do not cease to give thanks for you, remembering you in my prayers, **17** that the God of <u>our Lord Jesus Christ</u>, the Father of glory, may give you the <u>Spirit</u> of wisdom and of revelation in the knowledge of him, **18** having the eyes of your hearts enlightened, that <u>you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance in the saints, **19** and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power toward us who believe, according to the working of his great might **20** that he worked in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places, **21** far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and above every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the one to come. **22** And he put all things under his feet and gave him as head over all things to the church, **23** which is his body, the fullness of him who fills all in all.</u>

Eph. 2:1 And you were <u>dead</u> in the trespasses and sins **2** in which you once walked, following the course of this world, following the prince of the power of the air, the spirit that is now at work in the <u>sons of disobedience</u>— **3** among whom <u>we all</u> once lived in the passions of our flesh, carrying out the desires of the body and the mind, and were by nature <u>children of wrath</u>, like the rest of mankind.

Eph. 2:4 But God, being rich in mercy, because of the great love with which he loved <u>us</u>, **5** even when <u>we</u> were dead in our trespasses, <u>made us alive together with Christ</u>—by grace you have been saved— **6** and <u>raised us up with him</u> and seated <u>us</u> with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, **7** so that in the coming ages he might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus.



Eph. 2:18 For through him <u>we both</u> have <u>access</u> in <u>one Spirit</u> to the Father. **19** So then you are <u>no longer strangers and aliens, but you are fellow citizens</u> with the saints and members of the <u>household of God</u>, **20** built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Christ Jesus himself being the cornerstone, **21** in whom the whole structure, <u>being joined together</u>, grows into a holy temple in the Lord. **22** In him you also are being built together into a dwelling place for God by the Spirit.

Eph. 4:1 I therefore, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called, **2** with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, **3** eager to maintain the <u>unity of the Spirit</u> in the bond of peace. **4** There is <u>one body</u> and <u>one Spirit</u>—just as you were called to the <u>one hope</u> that belongs to your call— **5** <u>one Lord</u>, <u>one faith</u>, <u>one baptism</u>, **6** <u>one God</u> and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all.

Eph. 4:17 Now this I say and testify in the Lord, that <u>you must no longer walk as the Gentiles do</u>, in the futility of their minds.

2 - Ephesians - Mystery of the Gospel

Eph. 3:1 For this reason I, Paul, a prisoner of Christ Jesus on behalf of you Gentiles— 2 assuming that you have heard of the stewardship of God's grace that was given to me for you, 3 how the mystery was made known to me by revelation, as I have written briefly. 4 When you read this, you can perceive my insight into the mystery of Christ, 5 which was not made known to the sons of men in other generations as it has now been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit.

Eph. 3:6 This mystery is that the <u>Gentiles are fellow heirs, members of the same body, and partakers of</u> the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel.

Eph. 3:7 Of this gospel I was made a minister according to the gift of God's grace, which was given me by the working of his power. **8** To me, though I am the very least of all the saints, this grace was given, to preach to the Gentiles the unsearchable riches of Christ, **9** and to bring to light for everyone what is the plan of the mystery hidden for ages in God, who created all things, **10** so that through the church the manifold wisdom of God might now be made known to the rulers and authorities in the heavenly places. **11** This was according to the eternal purpose that he has realized in Christ Jesus our Lord, **12** in whom we have boldness and access with confidence through our faith in him.
