Prayer application from Sunday's sermon, "RIDICULOUS SUPPLY"

In this week's sermon, two stories contained in II Kings 4:38-44 challenge our faith that God is a God of ridiculous supply and wants us to learn how to depend on Him.

- 1.) Read II Kings 4:40. Did the 100 men believe God could supply their needs? Do you believe God can supply your needs? Do you go to Him with your needs? Or do you depend on self-sufficiency?
- 2.) Read II Kings 4:41. How did Elisha know to put flour in the poisoned soup? Did he perform the miracle of the soup being made edible?
- 3.) Read II Kings 4:42. Did the man from Baal Shalishah withhold his tithe in a time of famine? Are you bringing to God your first fruits despite your present circumstances?
- 4.) Read II Kings 4:43. How did Elisha know the 20 loaves of barley would feed 100 men?
- 5.) Did Elisha do both miracles in his own strength? How did his faith impact the outcome?
- 6.) Compare II Kings 4:43-44 to Matthew 14:13-21. How do these stories differ? How is Jesus the greater source Elisha and the other prophets depended on?
