Matthew 5:38-42

I. What the rabbis taught: personal reveng Equivalent restitution by force: eye for ar	
Derived from OT Law: Exod 21:24-25; Lev 24:20; Deut 19:21

The Pharisees were distorting and abusing them.

II. What Jesus taught: DO NOT RESIST AN EVIL PERSON! (v39)
Cf. Eph 6:13: resist the devil, but not an evil person. ?!
Everything in us wants to change this! So He gives four illustrations/applications to prevent that:
A. BEING (v39b)
Not pacifism. Distinguish individual from state (Rom 13). What He forbids is <i>personal</i> retaliation
B. BEING (v40)
C. BEING (v41)
D. BEING (v42)
III. How Jesus modeled what He taught
Isa 50:6 → Matt 26:59-63, 67 ;
27:27-31, 39-44
I Peter 2:21-23 → 24-25!
How this searches our hearts! I rise to defend my rights as naturally as breathing! Who can obey it? It is a supernatural response.
What would happen if the world saw Christians respond to personal attacks in this way rather than seeking to meet force with force?
