Rom II Co Phil	examples from Paul: n 1:9-10; or 1:23; 1:8; ess 2:5
Even G	od takes an oath: Heb 6:17-19 (v16: ok for men)
B. Oaths a	are not necessary if you are honest
Lev 19:	12 is connected to v11: do not deceive!
1. A	are two kinds of oaths: ssertions about the past or present: Yes, I did" or "No, I didn't" are enough
2. P	romises about the future:

"Yes, I will" or "No, I won't" are enough

	God's oath: Hebrews 6:13-20
	Refers to His oath to Abraham in Gen 22:15-18: blessing to the nations
	Psm 132: He swears to David: His King on the Throne forever
	Jesus comes: the Word, full of grace & Truth (Jn 1:14, 17-18) to truly make the Father known (cf. Jn 14:6)
	He dies for liars like you and me
	Heb 6:18-20: His oath is an anchor fixed in! You are safe because He can never lie!

	You put on truth with the Gospel:
	Eph 4:22-25; Col 3:9-10; Psm 15:2, 4; Deut 28:9-10
	You can only tell the truth by in His promises • God's provision • God's protection
