¹Now a certain man was sick, Lazarus of Bethany, the village of Mary and her sister Martha.

Luke 10:38-42

²It was the Mary who anointed the Lord with ointment, and wiped His feet with her hair, whose brother Lazarus was sick.

God's Ways are Not Always Our Ways

³So the sisters sent *word* to Him, saying,

“Lord, behold, he whom You love is sick.” ⁴But when Jesus heard *this*, He said,

“This sickness is not to end in death,

but for the glory of God, (9:1-3)

so that the Son of God may be glorified by it.”

So when He heard that he was sick,

He then stayed two days *longer* in the place where He was.

⁷Then after this He said to the disciples, “Let us go to Judea again.”

⁸The disciples said to Him, “Rabbi, the Jews were just now seeking to stone You, and are You going there again?”

⁹Jesus answered, “Are there not twelve hours in the day?”

If anyone walks in the day, he does not stumble, because he sees the light of this world.

¹⁰“But if anyone walks in the night, he stumbles, because the light is not in him.”
