Prolegomena

Prolegomena [pro·le·gom·e·na] n. pl.

1. Prefatory remarks. The prolegomena of a systematic theology is essentially an introduction and presents methodological questions that pertain to the nature and task of theology.

2. The Three T's of Theology. When someone is exposed to Reformed theology for the first time, the questions about doctrine and life (otherwise known as faith and practice) can be daunting. Essentially all of theology can be broken down to three t's:

- 1) Text (Scripture; God's Word is foundational to all of theology and life for that matter)
- 2) Term (a name that grounds the concept to a systematic design)
- 3) Time (a date or era from which the term develops or expands)
