Sermon: Hebrews 13:17

1. Read 1 Cor. 16:13-18. This is an interesting passage for it dispels the myth that submissiveness is equal to cowardness. A. Look closely at verse 13 and 16 specifically. List out the behaviors that Paul commands of them.

B. This passage is also interesting because it does not necessarily mention elders, shepherds, or overseers that the Corinthians were to be subject to, but to this household of strong mature believers. How have you been blessed by being subject to more mature believers in your life?

2. Two other types of submission are also in Titus 2:3-5. A. What are they and what are the benefits listed?

How could a wife's non-submission to her husband cause the word of God to be reviled?

B. Is the submission of younger women to older women in the teaching of how to be married and how to raise their children common in our society? Christianity? Why

or why not?

3. Failure to submit to the proper authority was the first sin of Adam and Eve and is still a temptation that must be fought against. The human nature seems to be naturally desirous of autonomy (self-lawed). Can such a high view of self-rule be a danger to the life of a church? How so?

4. Church leadership can affect the health of a church. Most of us have experienced a multitude of styles of leadership over the years. What would be some possible consequences of a church whose leadership was:

A. Too passive to call out false teaching.

B. Too nonconfrontational to call out sin.

C. Too controlling of ministry among the members.

5. Believers are to be actively ministering to other believers. According to 1 Thess. 5:14 what are some things that you should be doing?
