EASTER, RESURRECTION SUNDAY

"The <u>resurrection of Jesus Christ</u> is that central moment in human history that serves as the foundational doctrine of <u>Christianity</u>. After having truly taking on human form and submitted to an agonizing and shameful public <u>death</u>, the eternal <u>Son of God</u> was truly raised from the <u>dead</u> in his glorified physical body, no longer subject to decay and <u>death</u>. His resurrection validates his identity as the divine Son of God, demonstrates his irrevocable victory over death and the <u>grave</u>, and secures both the present <u>salvation</u> and future physical <u>resurrection</u> of believers." [Lexham Survey of Theology]
