"A Foot Race with a Surprise Ending"

John 20: 1 - 9

Now on the first *day* of the week Mary Magdalene *came early to the tomb, while it *was still dark, and *saw the stone *already* taken away from the tomb. ² So she *ran and *came to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and *said to them, "They have taken away the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid Him." ³ So Peter and the other disciple went forth, and they were going to the tomb. ⁴ The two

were running together; and the other disciple ran ahead faster than Peter and came to the tomb first; ⁵ and stooping and looking in, he *saw the linen wrappings lying *there*; but he did not go in. ⁶ And so Simon Peter also *came, following him, and entered the tomb; and he *saw the linen wrappings lying *there*, ⁷ and the face-cloth which had been on His head, not lying with the linen wrappings, but rolled up in a place by itself. ⁸ So the other disciple who had first come to the tomb then also entered, and he saw and believed. ⁹ For as yet they did not understand the Scripture, that He must rise again from the dead.



Easter Offering Recipient

Galmi Hospital, in Niger, will be the recipient of our Easter sacrificial offering this year. Matt and Tara Megill, missionaries supported by us, are serving in Niger. Matt is the director of HIV & TB Programs and when asked about their needs, turned the focus to the hospital itself.

Galmi Hospital was built in 1950, outside the town of Galmi in south central Niger. The hospital began with one doctor but quickly expanded to a 56-bed facility. Today the hospital has 180 beds, three operating theatres, an HIV clinic, malnutrition center and an outpatient program that handles over 250 cases per day. Most of the doctors are missionaries but the nursing and medical support roles are covered by Nigeriens. This site will continue to be needed as a hospital for many years to come. Niger is one of the poorest and least developed countries in the world. According to the 2020 UN Human Development Index, Niger ranks 189th out of 189 countries. Many of the existing health facilities are cost prohibitive for the average Nigerien.

Galmi Hospital is often the only hospital that people can afford to use. Although government-run hospitals are subsidized for the care they provide, patients incur the cost of all medicines and/or materials. These must be purchased at private pharmacies which are beyond the means of the majority of Nigeriens. Galmi Hospital provides a comprehensive care for set fees that are within reason. Galmi Hospital also provides free care through our benevolent fund to people who would be rejected from government care, despite the severity of their condition due to their inability to pay. Galmi Hospital draws patients from across Niger. In this largely Muslim nation, only 0.3% of the population is Christian, and so this hospital with its evangelists and Christian proclamation represents a strategic Gospel center for

the nation. Every patient who visits the outpatient department will have the opportunity to hear the Gospel by means of the Jesus Film in the waiting room as well as their interaction with Christian doctors who are encouraged to take time with patients to share their faith and pray with them.

The ministry goals and vision for this project is to redevelop hospital facilities for the provision of high-quality medical care and to manage the redevelopment in ways that will not interrupt the provision of services. Also, the goal is to continue to shine the light of Jesus Christ in Niger through the provision of high-quality medical care.

The project has been ongoing, but there is still work to do on the construction of a new medical ward. Please pray about your part in this special opportunity to be a light in the land of Niger. All of our gifts will be an encouragement to Matt and the other doctors and medical staff serving there.

CONCLUSION: Sunday morning Jesus wasn't dead anymore. The reality of His resurrection was just beginning to dawn on His followers and it would change them forever. It would give them life. What about you and me? We cannot see Him as they did, but we have their testimony and more importantly Jesus is still alive! He is the Christ. We are to believe and have life in His name.

Matthew 16: 21

From that time Jesus began to show his disciples that **he must** go to Jerusalem and suffer many things from the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and **on the third day be raised**.

John 10: 7 - 15

⁷ So Jesus again said to them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, I am the door of the sheep. ⁸ All who came before me are thieves and robbers, but the sheep did not listen to them. ⁹ I am the door. If anyone enters by me, he will be saved and will go in and out and find pasture. ¹⁰ The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. *I came that they may have life and have it abundantly*. ¹¹ I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. ¹² He who is a hired hand and not a shepherd, who does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and flees, and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. ¹³ He flees because he is a hired hand and cares nothing for the sheep. ¹⁴ I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, ¹⁵ just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and *I lay down my life for the sheep*.

Romans 4: 13 - 25

¹³ For the **promise** to Abraham and his offspring that he would be heir of the world did not come through the law but through the righteousness of faith. ¹⁴ For if it is the adherents of the law who are to be the heirs, faith is null and the promise is void. ¹⁵ For the law brings wrath, but where there is no law there is no transgression.

¹⁶ That is why it depends on faith, in order that the promise may rest on grace and be guaranteed to all his offspring—not only to the adherent of the law but also to the one who shares the faith of Abraham, who is the father of us all, ¹⁷ as it is written, "I have made you the father of many nations"—in the presence of the God in whom he believed, who gives life to the dead and calls into existence the things that do not exist. ¹⁸ In hope he believed against hope, that he should become the father of many nations, as he had been told, "So shall your offspring be." ¹⁹He did not weaken in faith when he considered his own body, which was as good as dead (since he was about a hundred years old), or when he considered the barrenness of Sarah's womb. ²⁰ No unbelief made him waver concerning the promise of God, but he grew strong in his faith as he gave glory to God, ²¹ fully convinced that God was able to do what he had promised. 22 That is why his faith was "counted to him as righteousness." ²³ But the words "it was counted to him" were not written for his sake alone, ²⁴ but for ours also. It will be counted to us who believe in him who raised from the dead Jesus our Lord, 25 who was delivered up for our trespasses and raised for our justification.

Sunday Morning

READ John 20:1-9; 30-31; Romans 4:13-25; Psalm 80:1-19. DISCUSS, Why did Jesus have to die? Be specific. Why did He have to rise from the dead? What did He accomplish through His resurrection? Is His life now the grounding of all your hope in this life and the next? PRAY "Jesus, You are Lord of all. Please help us to submit to You in every aspect of our lives, individually, in our families, and together as a congregation at FCCW."

Monday

READ John 2:18-22; 17:22-23; 20:1-9; 30-31; Matthew 16:21-25; 27:63. DISCUSS, How did Jesus talk about His impending death before going to Calvary? Why is this significant? Why did Jesus die? What did His resurrection from the dead on the third day prove? MEDITATE on John 2:22. PRAY, "Lord, You have come just as You promised to do what only You could do as fully man and fully God."

Tuesday

READ John 20:1-9; 30-31; Matthew 12:38-42; Jonah 1:17-3:10. DISCUSS, what is the relationship between Jesus and Jonah? What is the significance of three days? God the Father returns both of them from the depths. Why? MEDITATE on John 2:22. PRAY, "Jesus, thank You for conquering death for us. Please enable us to repent."

Wednesday

READ **John 10:7-18**; **20:30-31**; **7:1-10** DISCUSS, Jesus says repeatedly, "I lay down my life ..." Why? What is the significance of His taking it back up again? How does this explain what is going on in His resurrection? MEDITATE on **John 2:22**. PRAY, "Jesus, thank You for fulfilling all that You promised. *You are a good and faithful Lord!* Help us serve you well."

Thursday

READ John 5:24-40; 20:30-31; Acts 4:8-12. DISCUSS, Eternal life with Christ is more than just unending life. What is life in Christ? How does our life in Christ now differ from others? How will it differ eternally? MEDITATE on John 2:22. PRAY, "Lord, teach us to walk in Your ways. Guide us in Your truth. Enable us to enjoy eternal life with You."

Friday

READ John 20:1-9; 30-31; Romans 4:13-25; Psalm 80:1-19. DISCUSS, How has God been teaching you from these passages this week? MEDITATE on John 2:22. PRAY for faithfulness at FCCW and revival throughout the area.

Saturday
