## Love for your Neighbor

(Selected Scriptures from I John)

Introduction: Love: the greatest of all commands - Matthew 22:37-40

I. Loving others is evidence that you have come to the light of salvation (I John 2:9-11)

## II. Loving others is evidence that you love God (I John 5:1)

To love other believers should be as natural as loving your own family, because we <u>are</u> family, real family.

We know the same <u>God</u>. We are partakers of the same <u>Spirit</u>. We are joint heirs with the same <u>Son</u> (Jesus Christ). We share the same <u>faith</u>. We eat the same <u>food</u> (God's Word). We have the same <u>name</u> ("Christian"). We will inherit the same <u>future</u> (eternal life). We face the same battles.

- III. Loving others is the distinctive virtue for the child of God (I John 3:10-18)
  \* Do you really love your brother?
  - A. Love is a distinguishing trait that separates a believer from a non-believer (v.10)
  - B. Love is a message believers should know about right from the start of their conversion (v.11)
  - C. Love is not envious or jealous of the spiritual success or prosperity of another (v.12-13)
  - D. Love offers the assurance that one has been transferred from the realm of death to the realm of eternal life (v.14-15)
  - E. Love is not mere talk, but sacrificial action toward others in need (v.16-18) Practical ways to express Love for others:
    - Love "washes feet" (John 13:13-17)
    - Love shares possessions (Acts 4:32)
    - Love Gives & Forgives
