Examine the Scriptures (Be Berean!)

- Gospel Parallels to Foot Washing: None
- Gospel Accounts of the "Hour" concerning His Death: Mat 26:17 - 27:66; Mark 14:12 - 15:47; Luke 22:1 - 23:56
- John's Account of the day before and the day of Jesus' death: John 13 - 19

Consider & Discuss (Be Transformed!)

- Recall the context of the Jewish Passover feast (1a) and identify the significance of Jesus' death at this time..
- What did Jesus intend to communicate by washing His disciples feet at this time; and how is His foot washing and expression of His love (1b)?
- What did Jesus mean when He told Peter, "If I do not wash you, you have **no part with Me**."
- What did Jesus charge us (His 21st century disciples) to do when He said in v. 14, "you also ought to wash one another's feet" and in v. 15, "you also should do as I did to you"?
- How can we do what He charged us to do?

Memory & Meditation Verse

13 You call Me Teacher and Lord; and you are right, for so I am. **14** If I then, the Lord and the Teacher, washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. **15** For I gave you an example that you also should do as I did to you. **16** Truly, truly, I say to you, a slave is not greater than his master, nor is one who is sent greater than the one who sent him. **17** If you know these things, you are blessed if you do them. John 13:13-17
