Sealing up vision and prophecy	Matt 5:21; Heb. 1:1

#### From the issuing of a decree (word) to restore and rebuild Jerusalem (25)

- This decree must be from Cyrus (Isa. 44:23-45:14) in 538 BC
- The decree is an answer to Daniel's prayer (9:23)

#### Until Messiah the Prince there shall be seven weeks and sixty-two weeks

· An unmistakable observation: there are three time frames, three groups of sevens
