 - 2. Notice the nature of the rebukes
 - 3. The warnings against compromise and idolatry are striking

 - 1. Not pre-written history, per se, only relevant to the final generation
 - 2. A wartime manual on perspective and perseverance
 - 3. Depicting spiritual realities true in every age
