## III. The Style of the Book of Revelation

- A. The Genre (literary type)
  - 1. It is apocalyptic the use of symbols
  - 2. It is prophetic (1:3; 22:7)
  - 3. It is epistolary (introduction, exhortation, conclusion, to the churches)
- B. Rich in symbolism

  Beale, 69 "The General Purpose of Symbolism in the Apocalypse"
- C. Rich in O.T. imagery
  Revelation has more O.T. references than any other NT book.

## IV. The Structure of the Book of Revelation

- A. General Futurist Understanding of the Book's Structure (Dispensational)
  - 1. Rev. 1:17 What you have seen, (1:9-20); what are (2-3); what must come to pass (6-22)

- B. Progressive Recapitulation (Progressive Parallelism)
  - 1. Definition: the Book of Revelation follows a repetitive or cyclical pattern, where there is thematic overlap and progression. The seal, trumpets and bowls run parallel with each, each set of seven spanning the time between the First Advent and Second Advent. The Book then follows an Already/Not prophetic perspective, which culminates each time with final judgment and salvation.

  - a) 6:12-17 // 7:9-17
  - b) 11:18a // 11:18b
  - c) 14:14-20 // 15:2-4
  - d) 16:17-21 (17:1-18:24) // 19:1-10
  - e) 20:7-15 // 21:1-8
  - f) 21:9-22:5 (11:14-18; 16:17; 21:6; 6:12-17)

- 4. The Obvious Structural Pattern of Seven
- 5. Repetition of Themes, Images and Phrases
  - a) three and half years (11:2-3; 12:6, 14; 13:5)
