SCRIPTURE READINGS: Exodus 20:1-17 and John 21

SINGING: 181:1-4-328:1, 3-223:1-3-358:3-4-Dox #8-368:1, 4, 5

JESUS' INSTRUCTIONS FOR HIS KINGDOM LABORERS

I. That He often uses our failures to bless us (vs. 1-4)

- A. Why they 'went fishing' is unclear, yet it is clear that their efforts failed
- B. Their failure despite best efforts opened the door to blessing in learning
- C. Let's learn from our failures or our inability to bring success

II. That with Him alone we will have success (vs. 5-6)

- A. In God's Kingdom nothing will succeed except by His sovereign power
- B. Success in ministry is never due to the *instrument* (John 3:27; 15:5)
- III. That He doesn't need us though is pleased to use us (vs. 9-10; 12-13)

IV. That He is not unmindful of our His laborers' needs (vs. 9-13)

- A. Labor in God's kingdom can be very discouraging and wearying
- B. Therefore Christ invites His laborers: Come and Dine of what I prepared

V. That love is the most important ingredient in all our service to Christ

- A. Jesus questions to Peter plump our inner motivation to Him (vs. 15-17)
 - 1. There is a growing climax in Jesus' 3 questions
 - 2. These questions search our *motivation* for all our Kingdom labor
- B. True grace reveals itself in love (vs. 15-17)

VI. That our love to Christ is to be expressed in devotion to His sheep

- A. Kingdom laborers are to care for Christ's people (vs. 10-11; 15-17)
 - 1. We are to be fishers of men but also shepherds of His sheep
- B. Our care is to be according to the needs of His people (vs. 15-17)
 - 1. Not all His people are similar: there are lambs and sheep a. lambs: young believers with beginning God's work of grace
 - b. sheep: more established believers
 - 2. Our task is the *feed them appropriately* (1 Tim. 4:12-16)
- C. The 'laborer's task' is given us by risen Lord Himself

VII. That our main duty is to follow Christ (vs. 18-19)

- A. Lord warns Peter about the coming test of his love: vs. 18
- B. Our sole duty is to follow our Lord (vs. 19-23)

THOUGHTS ON THE QUALIFICATIONS FOR THE MINISTRY

Nearness to Christ, intimacy with Him, assimilation to His character – these are the elements of a ministry of power. (H. Bonar)

Churches are looking for better methods: God is looking for better men. (E. Bounds)
