## Ephesians 5:22-24 SAVED WIFE'S CALLING TO BE SUBMISSIVE

- I. The important setting.
  - A. The calling of wives is closely connected to the self-submission of all believers to one another (21; 4:2-16).
  - B. Second, practically no man is really the head of his marriage unless the wife submits.
  - C. Our text is denied and mocked today because of the equality of the sexes or the woman having the same or greater gifts.
  - D. The Christian view of marriage is antithetical to that of the world and of our fleshly desires, because it is "unto the Lord."
- II. To "submit" is to put oneself under another.
  - A. This is a spiritual submission, not physical (inferior under superior), but just the recognition God's authority.
  - B. The godly wife takes a position of submission by giving herself in such a way that she is living for him a help to him.
  - C. It is a voluntary submission.
  - D. The submission/subjection is to be "in everything" (24), for the church is subject to Christ in everything.
  - E. This submission (with charity) is the attitude which properly calls him to repentance for any and all sins
  - F. When there is no submissiveness, there will be a loss of peace in the marriage and in your soul.
- III. The reasons for submission.
  - A. First, your husband is "your own" (cf. Col. 3:18; Titus 2:5; I Peter 3:1), i.e., the one God Himself brought to you.
  - B. Two, submission to your own husband is to be performed in faith to Jesus, "as unto the Lord."
  - C. Third, submission is required because "the husband is the head of the wife, even as Christ is the head of the church."
  - D. Your Savior and Lord is the fountain from which you are to drink to gain the ability to submit.
    - 1. Submit as He submitted.
    - 2. Submit to Him for all that He has done for you.
