- 1. PILATE BELIEVED JESUS WAS INNOCENT AND UNDERSTOOD WHAT DROVE THE JEWS (27:15-18).
 - a. A convenient tradition and notable prisoner took the pressure off Pilate and opened the door for Jesus' death (27:15-16).
 - b. Pilate asked a question that unwittingly led to Jesus' death (27:17-18).
 - (1) Pilate truly believed that Jesus was innocent.
 - (2) Pilate accomplished five things by asking that question.
- 2. PILATE RECEIVED ANOTHER SIGN OF JESUS' INNOCENCE FROM HIS WIFE (27:19).
 - a. Pilate's wife had a troubling dream (27:19)
 - b. The Jewish leaders turned the minds of the people against Jesus (27:20).
 - c. Pilate asked three questions that sealed Jesus' crucifixion (27:21-24).

3. F	ILATE	MADE	A FINAL	AND	FUTILE	ATTEMPT	TO	CLEAR	HIMSELF	OF	THE	GUILT	OF	Jesus'	DEATE
(27	:24-2	6).													

- a. Pilate seeing the inevitable reluctantly caved in to their demands (27:24).
- b. The Jews gladly took the guilt for Jesus' death (27:25).
- c. Pilate turned Jesus over to crucifixion (27:26).
- 4. APPLICATIONS:
- (1) Knowing Jesus as carrying on the great work of our salvation in standing before Pilate and the Jews as our innocent Substitute.
 - (2) Meditating on Jesus in that respect.
 - (3) Believing on Jesus in that respect.
 - (4) Loving Jesus in that respect.
