Α	. What is it?
•	An expository sermon takes the main point of a passage of Scripture, makes it the main point of the, and applies it to life today.
•	An expository sermon is different from a sermon, in which the preacher chooses a subject and then talks about it by gathering various verses of Scripture together.
•	In an expository sermon, the Bible has already what the preacher should say.

B. Where is it in the Bible?

• Romans 1-4 contains one of the fullest explanations of the Gospel, and 1 Corinthians 15.3-4 contains a short summary of the Gospel.

<u>1 Cor 15.3–4</u> For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, 4 that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures,

•	Membership is essential for church leaders to know who they are to, and for members to know who they are to

A	. What is it?
•	Church discipline is the act of sin in the life of the church, including the possible final step of excluding a professing Christian from church membership because of serious unrepentant sin.
В	. Where is it in the Bible?
	<u>Matt 18.15–17</u> "If your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault, between you and him alone. If he listens to you, you have gained your brother. 16 But if he does not listen, take one or two others along with you, that every charge may be established by the evidence of two or three witnesses. 17 If he refuses to listen to them, tell it to the church. And if he refuses to listen even to the church, let him be to you as a Gentile and a tax collector.

•	The primary purpose of church discipline is to a sinning Christian to repentance and holiness.
•	The second purpose of church discipline is to keep the church as God has commanded so that He may be glorified in the church.

•	Every reference to Elders in the Bible is always o (Acts 14.23, Acts 20.17, 1 Timothy 4.14, 1 Timothy 5.17, and James 5.14)
•	Paul gives the qualifications for Elders in 1 Timothy 3.1-7 and Titus 1.5-9.
C	. Why is it important?
•	Having a group of godly Elders is not only Biblical, but it provides a more thorough shepherding of church members'
•	God calls Elders to shepherd their church members by: o them by proclaiming God's Word (John 21.15-17) them in godliness (1 Tim. 4.16: 1 Pet. 5.3. Heb. 13.7)
